7 Lectures Hit Problems Of Race, Environment

Four suburban Lutheran congregations will launch a discussion and action program called "Project Concern" at Timothy Lutheran Church, 8820 Wayne Road, Livonia, on Monday, April 6.

"Project Concern" to which the public is invited, will consist of seven two-hour sessions on Monday nights. Prominent speakers will confront participants with the pressing urban, racial and environmental problems of the metropolitan Detroit area.

On April 6, Dr. Abe Citron of Wayne State University will discuss the dynamics of prejudice, the use of selective perception, and how we fool ourselves into thinking we are right.

On April 20, Edward Robinson, director of the Metropolitan Detroit Citizen's Development Authority, will speak on the problems of achieving an adequate home in a decent environment, blighted areas and slums, building codes and open housing.

"Poverty and its Social Consequences" will be considered on April 27. William Shelton of the Michigan Credit Union League, and Dr. Pat Shontz, economist with the Detroit News, will speak via videotape presentation and describe the effects of poverty, who the poor really are, welfare and ADC, and why the poor pay more.

On May 4, "People Classes and Their Problems" will be the basis of a panel discussion. Among other things the panel will probe the myth or fact of the generation gap, dissident

youth, society dropouts, and drug abuse.

No meeting is scheduled May 11.

"Human Relations and Power Movements" will be the subject May 18, with William Hawkins, director of Community and Social Development, MDCDA, speaking on individual justice, black and white power, and race relations.

In the final session, May 25, the well-known Catholic layman, Joseph L. Hanskecht Jr., will show how the power of God's love can be brought to bear on these problems and he will suggest ways individuals and congregations can organize for action.
