Three safety division members sta-tioned in the Oakland County Jail lobby lost their jobs last week but were rehired within an hour. First, the Oakland County Board of Commissioners voted 20-5 to eliminate that three safety.

Commissioners voted 29.5 to eliminate the three positions at the request of Oakland Sheriff Johannes Spreen. Because safety division officers are now deputited by County Executive Daniel T. Murphy, Spreen no longer wanted them in his domain.

Sprean requested that he either be authorized overtime or receive funds to three additional personnel to assume the three difficult of the safety division officers said to The Land County of the safety division officers would be fired and no replacements hired.

AFTER voting to eliminate the jobs, commissioners reconsidered and decid-ed to refer it to their personnel com-mittee for further study.

In addition, the committee will dis-cuss a proposal from Commissioner Lawrence Pernick, D-Southfield, to reallocate the responsibilities of the safety division and sheriff's deputies.

"It would put all those with law en-forcement powers in the sheriff's de-partment and those people who are building watchmen in the safety divi-sion under the county executive," said Pernick.
"It will also save the county \$350,000 because there would be no need for,11 positions."


