Fire chief objects to decal

There's a difference of opinion between Ronald McDonald and Farmington Hills Fire Chief Lerry Karon concerning fire safety.

Karon discourages the practice of placing "Tot Spot" window decals on the bedroom window of rooms where children sleep. McDonald just finished a six-week campaign, aided by public service announcements on television, promoting the stickers.

About 600,000 "Tot Spot" decals were distributed in the restaurant promotion, says Jill Denman, public relations account executive for McDonald's in Michigan. She says the public

in Michigan. She says the public showed great interest in the program. But Karon doesn't share in the enthu-

siasm.

He says the decals may confuse fire-fighters in a time of a fire emergency

rather than aid them. Persons move an average of every five years and an old sticker on a window may bring fire-fighters to a room that is unoccupied by the new inabitants.

"It also lets undestrable people—sosibly even a child molester—know that a child may be in the room," Karon said.

Burglars may decide to enter a bedroom with such a sticker on an outside
window, he claimed, figuring that
they're unlikely to encounter physical
resistance from a child.

"WE MAKE a systematic search of the premises any time there's a resi-dential fire," Karon said. "Of course, a bedroom is always of utmost consider-ation in any firefighter's mind in a resi-dential fire."

Moting that not all fire departments support use of the stickers, Denman said reaction to the McDonald's cam-

paign among fire officials has been spill "about \$0/50 maybe leaning more toward the departments that favor it."

The Detroit Fire Department whole-heartedly backed the program, she said, while officials of other departments said they wished they were notified before the advertisements were

aired.
"I guess my reaction is, even if they use a systematic approach in looking for persons trapped in a fire, you've got to start somewhere first and it doesn't hurt to go to that bedroom with the sticker first," Denman said.

"If it helps to save one child's life, it's worth it. That's my position."
Farmington Public Safety Director G. Robert Safetr says he understands Karon's objections because the value of the stickers is limited. But, unlike Karon, he doesn't discourage person, he doesn't discourage he stickers from applying the stickers to their children's bedroom windows.

"WE WANT to support any legitimate effort any well-meaning group does to support fire awareness," Selfert says. "The real benefit of a program like this may be that they thought about the possibility of a home fire for the first time and formed an exaction plan."

Karon supports the practice of families conducting a mock fire emergencies with each member of the family inding a way out, including alternative routes if the normal passage is blocked by a blaze.

To avoid confusion in a time of a real emergency, Karon says, family members should agree to meet at a central location outside if there is a fire. This can avoid tragic confusion caused firity inps made into burning homes looking for persons who are already safe.


