# Marion fells softball giant

Joan Scheerer says her Marian softball team is underestimated.

Groves' coach Steve Crane may be inclined to agree after his team absorbed a 2-0 shocking from the Mustangs in a pre-district qualifying game Tuesday at Marian.

Marian now advances to the state Class A district playoffs at 10 a.m. Saturday at Royal Oak Memorial Field against the winner of the Troy-Troy Athens pre-district game.

Groves, considered a state title contender before Tuesday's game, is now 20-7 overall.

Julie Riley was the winning pitcher, striking out seven, walking just two and allowing just two hits. Colleen McGovern pitched well for Groves in a losing cause, losing a six-hitter while fanning one and walking one.

"She (Riley) isn't as quick as McGovern, but she has just as much control," noted Marian coach Joan Scheerer.

"She had another two-hitter and a three-hitter this year, but she really had their (Groves) players' talking today — she would come through with a fastball and then change up on them.

"We've been underestimated all year long," said Scheerer. "We've played Groves five times in the three years that I've been here, and we're up three games to two."

The only scoring of the game came in the fourth and sixth innings.

Marian got its first run in the fourth when sophomore Renee Ambrose lashed a double and was singled home by Riley. The Mustangs got their second and final tally on a single by Beth Dean, a fielder's choice and an RBI single by Jill Acquire.

Dean finished the game with two hits, while teammates Ambrose and Ronnie Winter had one each.

McGovern and Laura Sexton had the only hits for the Falcons.

With the win, Marian will advance to the district playoffs, where the Mustangs will face the winner of the Troy-Troy Athens pre-district on Saturday at 10 a.m.

The Mustangs are currently 10-16 on the season, while the loss ended Groves season at 20-7.

"We just didn't have any sticks at all — it was like we were trying to kill it all day," said Crane. "The meat of our order got only one hit in 10 times at bat."

AVONDALE'S SEASON came to an end Tuesday as the Yellowjackets fell to Warren Fitzgerald 8-4 in pre-district play.

**MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSITION**

"As a renewal of millage previously authorized which expired in 1981, shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied against all taxable real and tangible personal property in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, be increased, as provided by Section 6, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan by \$3.00 per one thousand dollars of the assessed valuation, as finally equalized, of all such property in said School District for a period of five (5) years, from 1982 to 1986, both inclusive, for the purpose of paying general operating expenses of the School District?"
