YODER SAID he would understand public objection to the closed-door and telephone deliberations over the appointment "if we picked somebody off the street nobody knew." But the appointee will likely be someone who has served the city on an advisory board, Yoder says.

"If we pick somebody who served on the planning commission or the zoning board, they already have credibility and I see no need for an interview of some of the candidates," says Yoder.

The only woman whose name has come up in discussions with council members is Shirley Richardson.

"It's a surprise to me," she said when learned she was accepted for consideration

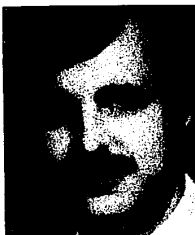
the post.

While the city manager asked her if she'd be willing to accept another term on the planning commission, Richardson said nobody has asked her if she'd like to serve on the council.

"I'd certainly be interested in the city of Farmington," she said.

Longshots, or names that came up for consideration last year when Mitchell was appointed to City Council, include Thomas Carr, Thomas Duke, James Mitchell and John Straky.

Mayor Bennett said he would like to see someone appointed from the Meadows subdivision or Chatham Hills. It is a personal desire of his, Bennett said, to have "representation from various parts of the city" and neither neighborhood is now represented on the council.

now, and it's difficult to operate under those conditions. We're leasing those areas right now so it seemed like to right time to make the move. We've started our growth."

The company did \$10 million in sales last year, according to documents filed with the city, and \$8 million of that came from the roofing materials they distribute. The biggest selling item is a rubber membrane for re-roofing called Sure-Seal, made by Carlisle Tire & Rubber Co.
