Milk powder, not dye, whitens our skim milk

I heard that a white dye was added to skim milk to make it look better. What is it and is it harmful?

According to Chet Lackey of the Michigan Department of Agriculture, no dyes are added to milk. What is added to skim milk is dry Grade A skim milk powder. This is used as a flavor enhancer as well as giving the milk a whiter color. When fats are removed from milk, the color and flavor are diminished, so addition of dry milk powder makes an otherwise bland grey liquid more palatable.

We've lost two trees from our yard over the winter. I know it was a particularly hard winter, but could pollution have caused the trees to die? What types of trees do well in the city?

Urban stresses such as air pollution,

poor soil, drought conditions and climatic extremes can lessen the chances of tree survival in our cities. It is important to select varieties that can survive these unhealthy conditions.

Trees are powerful allies in the battle against air pollution. They remove carbon dioxide from the air and release oxygen which washes air. Gaseous pollutants and air particulates are also collected by the foliage and washed to the ground by rainfall.

The need to develop varieties of plant materials that can survive urban stress becomes increasingly important. Research is continuing in this field. Until more information is available, the following trees recommended as best able to survive urban conditions are red maple (acer rubrum), ginkgo (ginkgo biloba), Japanese black pine (pinus thunbergii), and willow oak (quercus phellos).

ECO-TIP: Become a Master Canner. Home economists from Cooperative Extension Service in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, and Washtenaw counties will teach the classes on pressure canning, water bath, freezing, drying, pickling and jams and jellies. For more information, call your local extension office.

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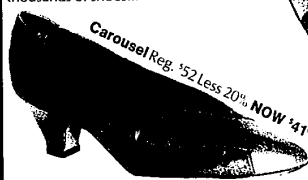
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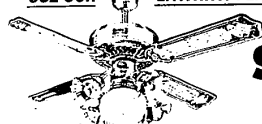
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
