Coach honored for 100 wins

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy girls' basketball coach Larry Baker is the recipient of the Century Club Award.

The award, offered by the Michigan High School Basketball Coaches Association, honors coaches who have attained at least 100 victories throughout their coaching careers. Baker has 147 victories.

This is the first year that the MHSBCA has given the award. The MHSBCA is attempting to make fans more aware of the time and effort that is put forth in accumulating 100 wins.

Baker will receive the award at the All-Star Festival (senior all-star games) June 19 at the Jonsson Fieldhouse on the Michigan State University campus.

Cranbrook High School tennis coach Don Brown will direct a summer instructional program set to begin this week.

Classes for ladies and children of most every age start today and run through June 23. The 10-lesson classes will be at the Cranbrook High School tennis courts.

Brown was named the 1976 Michigan Tennis Professional of the Year by the United States Professional Tennis Association. Last year, Brown was on the Michigan High School Tennis Rules Committee for both boys and girls.

Brown, a Birmingham resident who has been a tennis professional for the past 22 years, has taught such pupils as Craig Wittus, who is playing the professional circuit, and Jeff Etterbeck, who never lost a high-school match.

Space in the instructional program is limited. Two makeup lessons will be provided in case of poor weather, and a full summer Junior Tennis Program is available after participating in the clinics.
