Detroit's Grand Prix needs some fine tuning

"THE MONEY is not leaving here," said Sam Moses, who covered the race for Sports Illustrated. "It's a good deal."

"If the people had put it here, then it might not help it. I don't see many disadvantages. It seemed like a minor inconvenience for people going to work in Detroit has a tremendous amount of character. Chicago tried it and couldn't do it. I heard rumors about New York."

"I'm pulling for it here and hope it survives."

Moses, however, said that Grand Prix racing being a rich man's game is a "valid complaint."

"I can't relate to them and I cover them," he said. "I enjoy covering the stocks (NASCAR)."

The Sports Illustrated writer said the course "is too drastic." Also, whoever paved the course "should have their (bleep) chewed."

"The course is better than Long Beach," Moses added. "The big problem is that dead stop turn. Turn 5 (by Old Mariner's Church) could be a nice turn, but they have to remove that hairpin."

Christiano Chivagato, a writer for La Stampa, a magazine put out by Fiat in Torino, Italy, likes Detroit, but offers some suggestions:

"I THINK it was a good idea," said the Fiat writer who travels the circuit.

For some, like Argentine Cano, a native of Barcelona, Spain, now living in Windsor, he goes for "the love of the cars."

"I have a shop," explained Cano. "We paint the cars. I've been to Monte Carlo. It's a good vacation."

"It will be better organized if we come back here," said Didier Pironi of France, who finished third in a Ferrari.

"The course is very slow."

"The safety problems were bad when we arrived. They have to make longer runoff areas."

"Detroit Grand Prix officials listened to the drivers about safety. But no adjustments will have to be made next year."

ROBERT MCCABE, president of De-

troit Renaissance, Inc., was one of the organizers. The Grand Prix chairman termed the event a success. The group broke even the first time, according to his rough estimates.

"The problem I have is that these cars have no application to the streets," Moses said. "Ground-effect cars are advanced, but there are no shock absorbers. That's why the course is so damn bumpy. They should promote the turbos, instead."

"There's no application between this and the street. They ought to be more realistic."

The Detroit racing fans, who have sent a pilgrimage to Indy each year, had trouble understanding the Grand Prix quirks. No pit stops, elapsed time and two-hour time limits.

The fans must be educated. Everybody knows A.J. Foyt, but who is Keke Rosberg? The fans liked Eddie Cheever because he was the only American.

It was tough trying to figure out the leaders. At Indy, the leader board and public address announcer keep you informed on every lap.

Detroit will learn from its mistakes, but let's get auto people running the event so the fans can enjoy it.

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
