Candidates were asked...

In today's edition is a voters guide to Oakland Community College candidates prepared by the Leagues of Women Voters of Oakland County. Answers are grouped by whether the candidates were running for a six-year, four-year or two-year term on the OCC Board of Trustees.

Candidates were asked:
1. What do you see as the role of a community college trustee?
2. What would your priorities be if faced

with cuts in the college budget?
3. What other issues do you see facing the community college?
Where answers' exceeded space limitations, an ellipsis (...) indicates that words were deleted.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday. Five candidates are seeking two full six-year terms; five seek a single four-year term; and two seek a two-year term.

6-year terms

Two to be elected
EARL M. ANDERSON (incumbent), 30159 Palmer, Madison Heights. Education: University of Indiana, Wayne State; married, two children; charter member of the board of OCC, employed in labor relations since 1939; elected member of Madison Heights Charter Commission 1954, Lamphere PTA officer 1958-1961; coordinated contribution committee for Torch Drive 1956-62.

1. "As an elected trustee, you hire the president, make policy, and make sure the president follows that policy to a tee. The president is responsible for all activities within the school, and the board should not be rubber stamped for the administration."

2. "Cut administrators' pay first and then other employees' pay. Negotiate with the unions to encourage cutbacks before cutting programs."

3. "State of Michigan education cut backs."

WILLIAM J. CONDON, 5935 Kingfisher, Clarkston. Principal, Will Rogers Elementary School, Age 52, 21-year resident, Oakland County, married, wife Joyce, director - media Waterford Kettering High School; two sons, ages 22, 24. Professional experience - 31 years in education, teacher, elementary through graduate level, elementary principal, assistant director career ed. curriculum /staff development model (nation-wide), school district superintendent.

1. "To emphasize that OCC is a community college and should continue to

find new and better ways to serve 'life-long' educational needs of Oakland County residents. I would work for a curriculum that gives not only 'state of the art' job skills, but offers courses which will assist the individual in improving his/her quality of life."
