COREY, 31158 Perry Crossing, Farmington Hills, native of Detroit, father of three sons and twin daughters, president, owner for 15 years of three store retail chain, in Wayne and Oakland counties. Executive director, Golden Dental Plan, director of personnel, Dr. Golden Dental Centers. Graduated, Wayne State, business administration, BA; law degree, LL.B., University of Detroit, real estate, management and appraisal.

1. "To evaluate programs and expenditures and recommend budgets and course of studies, appointment of administrators and faculty members.

2. "Stressing retaining of persons who are now unemployed for new jobs, while maintaining the fine basic studies presently available at OCC.

3. "They are soon to face budget cuts from both federal and state governments. Therefore, in order to maintain the high quality educational programs and the addition of new areas of education, it will be necessary for very prudent spending in the future, even in Oakland County, which has always been the richest county in the country."

1. "Trustees are responsible for determining policy and must continually consider, in addition to finances: a) the skills required of citizens for those career areas that will survive or develop in the state, and b) the traditional career program opportunities that the well-rounded community college must offer its students.

2. "Since, due to world events, the industrial base of Michigan may be truly changing, it is important, in addition to current programs, to develop or modify programs and approaches that will support newly emerging high technology industries, which may be the future of the state of Michigan.

3. "The primary issue involves the recognition by the OCC board of the changing economic base in Michigan. This change in scope will exert pressures on the community college to meet counselling and re-training needs of those citizens whose jobs may never return. The apportionment of funding for programs to meet those needs and still maintain a comprehensive community college will be critical."

ILENE V. KOMER, 30341 Club House Lane, Farmington Hills. "I am 38 years old, wife, mother, student at Oakland Community College in the

Computer Science Department, own and operate a window treatment business. Community volunteer for American Red Cross, American Cancer Society and Mother's March of Dimes. President of the Woodstream Farms Homeowners Association two consecutive terms."

1. "An effective trustee has the responsibility for helping to bring new insights to the board. This can be accomplished with input from the college administrators and department heads, and by the trustees being aware of the changing and shifting needs of Oakland County residents. For a board to be most responsive and representative of Oakland County, it must be made up of people from a variety of backgrounds and experiences.

2. "The first issue to be looked at is the use of resources. Expanded use of the classroom space, equipment and teaching time can be attained through the recruiting of high school seniors, increased public information about special services such as kindergarten-12 enrichment courses, special rates for senior citizens, non-credit adult enrichment courses and other unique features of Oakland Community College. Conversely, building usage should be condensed to save on maintenance, deterioration from use and costly temperature control. The last place to look would be academic. The areas with the least student participation would have to see the first cutbacks so that what is offered would serve the greatest number of people in the community.

3. "To keep education with the grasp of Oakland County residents the board will have to keep credit hours as inexpensive as possible."

1. "The board of trustees has ultimate responsibility for the college. It sets the policy for the college and selects a qualified individual as president to serve as administrator of the college's programs and staff. It is the trustees' role to: a) make sure that the college is serving the needs and interests of its community and students; and b) seek input from the community itself to help determine those needs and interests.

2. "If faced with cuts in the college budget, my first priority would be to retain and save the instructional programs, which include vocational-technical programs and liberal arts and sciences programs. Before I would drop any programs from the college, I would
