Milliken addresses Country Day grads

When Helen Milliken addresses the 37th Detroit Country Day graduating class at 8 p.m. on Thursday at the Birmingham First United Methodist Church (1559 West Maple Road, Birmingham), she will help the originally all-male prep school celebrate a decade of Upper and Middle School co-education.
As the first woman to present the Commencement Address in Country Day's 66-year-plus history, Mrs. Milliken joins an illustrious group which includes the late Senator Philip A. Hart, Max M. Fisher, New York Times Editorial Board member James P. Brown, former General Motors Chairman Richard C. Gerstenberg and Albion College President Dr. Bernard T. Lomas. DCDS alumnus Harry T. Niderhiser gave the 1980 address and G.M. Vice-President William A. Ho-glund, a former school trustee, spoke to 1981 seniors.
Adding special significance to Mrs. Milliken's appearance, girls in the Class of '82 won nearly all of the senior honors, including the prestigious White...

Scholarship Cup "for the senior who maintains the highest academic average over four years." The George S. Scholgel Leadership Award for "the senior who demonstrates the most outstanding academic, intellectual and moral leadership." and The Headmaster's Cup, traditionally presented to the "senior who best combines the qualities of outstanding scholar, citizen and athlete."
DCD girls also won the top departmental awards in English, Science, Physics and Math as well as sharing the Stephen Myers Plaques for drama and the top music awards with their male classmates.
They won all four of the Headmasters Book Awards as well. These are given annually, at the discretion of the Headmaster, to "those seniors who have made outstanding contributions to the school in areas not previously or formally recognized." In addition, the President of the 1982 Student Council (Dawn Schluter) is only the second co-ed to hold that position. DCDS's two 1982 Presidential Scholars Finalists were also women — a first.
