# County board freezes wages

After a heated debate in caucus, Oakland County' Republican commis-sioners have joined their Democratic colleagues unanimously to approve a pay freeze for themselves and elimi-nate across-the-board wage hikes for county employees.

In addition, commissioners passed a resolution which directed the county executive not to spend any more in his 1993 budget than he did in 1982. That resolution covers all county departments.

"The county budget has gone up at the rate of \$10 million a year for 10 years," Commissioner Robert Page, Rimmingham, told the caucus.

"We have to find a way to hold does also spending. We're not asking for a big staff reduction like Wayne County. The concept of no salary increase will belo."




