'Three Present' travels the corporation circuit

"Three Present," an art show that was put together by three Farmington-area artists for Southfield's Cultural Art Association, is now traveling a corporation circuit in that city.

The artists, Gwen Tomkow, Donna Vogelheim and Monica Leaning, have each amassed a number of awards and prizes and are all active in both Farmington Artists Club and Palette and Brush.

The traveling show is the first event for Southfield Corporation Consortium, initiated by Marlowe Belanger, who got the Farmington Arts Commission under way here seven years ago. She is now Southfield's full-time art coordinator.

"Three Present" travels the circuit with Edie Joplich's one-man show and Bob Miller's one-man show. These artists are also Farmington Hills residents. Joplich was named Farmington's Artist-in-Residence for 1978. Miller is an employee of American Motors.

CONSORTIUM is usually a terminology of international combinations, but in this case the word translates as "a fellowship or association."

The fellowship between businesses is carried out by Bendix, Federal Mogul and American Motors Corp., who sponsored the pilot program. All three have an interest in bringing art to their employees as well as those who visit their buildings, a spokesman said.

All of the exhibitions are free and open to public viewing.

Belanger said she believes the consortium concept is unique.

"There have been a few beginnings, such as the line of sculpture near the river in Toronto, but we haven't found a complete concept anywhere," the Farmington Hills resident said.

"There's no known example for us to follow."

Working with small businesses as well as large corporations, about 30 firms are now involved, with that many activities planned for Consortium in the visual and performing arts.
