CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING June 14, 1982

Mayor Burwell opened the Regular City Council Meeting of the City of Farmington Hills on June 14, 1982, at 7:37 p.m. Members present were: Burwell, Dolan, Hughes, Lange, Scroten and Williams. Absent: Wolf. Others present were: City Manager Savage, Assistant City Manager Conitt, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Bibeau. The agenda was approved with the addition of item 11. a. to discuss City of Birmingham Resolution regarding Senate Bills 2172 and 2445. The minutes of May 24 and June 2 were approved as presented. Council agreed to execute one year's approval of Site Plan 84-9-80, Cluster Housing in Section 11. Council approved Economic Development Corporation Resolution No. 1 for Project District Area for Raymond and Joyce Rieger on Halsted at Grand River. Council approved Resolution No. 2 confirming the appointment of additional Economic Development Corporation members Dan Reynolds and James Peirce. Council approved Economic Development Corporation Resolution No. 1 for Project District Area for Joyce Ventures at 12 Mile and Orchard Lake Road. Council approved Resolution No. 2 confirming the appointment of additional Economic Development Corporation members Harlem Morris and R. C. Wise. Council approved Mayor's appointments to Boards and Commissions as indicated in Mayor Burwell's memo. Council approved going into executive session immediately following the meeting. Council agreed that the City of Farmington Hills enter into an agreement with Michigan Department of Transportation for the construction of concrete barriers and shoulder improvement at the intersection of Drake and I-696 and Inkster and I-696 and that the City Manager and City Clerk be authorized to sign the contract on behalf of the City. Council requested the City Attorney to draft a resolution similar to the one adopted by the City of Birmingham voicing objections to Senate Bills 2172 and 2445. Meeting adjourned at 10:15 p.m.

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. on June 7, 1982, by Mayor Alton L. Bennett in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. PRESENT: Mayor Bennett, Councilmen Hartsock, Mitchell, Yoder. CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Seifert, Attorney Kelly, City Clerk Bushey. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved. Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed. Council granted permission to two local college students to paint house addresses on curbs. Permission was granted to hold the Farmington Founders' Festival Parade on July 31st along the traditional Grand River route. Jack's Car Wash at Grand River and Orchard Lake was granted a sign variance to replace the Standard Oil sign with the Marathon Oil logo. Council supported House Bill 4334 controlling the manufacture and sale of armor-piercing bullets. Council received and filed a resolution from the City of Oak Park supporting continuation of Federal Student Aid. The following proclamations were issued: KIDS' DAY — JULY 27, 1982 MOSLEM SHRINE NEWSPEAPERS DAYS — JUNE 11-JUNE 12, 1982 Honoring Mark Richardson - Eagle Scout Council approved and adopted the Budget for the Fiscal Year 1982-83 and established the millage rate for the General Fund and Debt Service. Council authorized the City Manager to enter into Amendment No. 1 to the Sewage Service Agreement between the City of Detroit and the City of Farmington, effective June 30, 1982. The following appointments were made: Planning Commission - Charles Bridges, J. Lee Ratliff, Shirley Richardson; Farmington Building Authority - Clarence Shewbridge; Board of Zoning Appeals - JoAnne McShane; Farmington Historical Commission - Robert Walker, Howard Aldrich, Reta Moss-hamer. Farmington Beautification Committee - Carol Kurth, DeDe Adams, Richard Hatfield. Public Comments were received. The names of Bayard Tupper, Roger Walker, Del Cornwell, Reta Moss-hamer and John Washburn were read into the record as possible appointees for filling the Council vacancy. Councilman Hartsock was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Multi-Jurisdictional Cable Television Subcommittee. Monthly bills were approved for payment. The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
