Michigan's U.S. congressmen have filed their financial disclosure reports for 1981, and a check of area representatives in Washington reveals that Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, received more than \$100,000 in outside pay. Ford and other congressmen are uncompensated money elected officials receive for speaking before special-interest groups.

Ford, who serves as chairman of the House Education and Labor Committee and sits on the Post Office and Civil Service Committee, received the bulk of his money from postal-related and education groups, according to official documents.

For example, he received \$1,000 from the Federal Labor Relations Board, \$500 from the National Association of Postmasters, \$1,000 from the AFL-CIO Public Employee Department Convention and \$1,000 from the National Association of Cosmetology Schools.

Ford was also reimbursed for air fares and/or lodging for three speaking engagements and one building tour. In 1981, he spoke to the Inter-regional Center for Curriculum Development, Direct Mail Marketing Association, the

Center for International Education and toured Federal Express.

REP. CARL PURSELL, R-Plymouth, received \$1,900 in honorariums. The money came from Hazel Park Public Schools, Michigan Road Builders, Michigan Association of Counties, National Association of Fitness Directors and the University of Michigan.

Pursell, who sits on the Appropriations committee, he reported no gifts, reimbursement or liabilities. His only other reported assets are his Plymouth house and six acres of land valued in the \$100,001-\$250,000 bracket and his wife's undisclosed income as a Livonia Public School teacher.

REP. WILLIAM BROOMFIELD, R-Birmingham, reported no honorariums, gifts, reimbursements or liabilities.

His only reported outside income was interest on his stocks, bonds and U.S. Treasury bills. Most of his stocks and bonds are with utility companies or computer and technical business companies.

He sits on the Foreign Affairs and Small Business committees.

REP. WILLIAM BRODHEAD, D-Detroit, received \$7,200 in honorariums. Contributors of \$1,000 include COMEX and MARS, Inc. He also received honorariums from Cleveland State University, Chicago Mercantile Exchange, the Chicago Board of Trade and ITUS Corp., Clothing and Textile Workers, Warner Communications, ENCSRCH, Council of State Housing Agencies and the UAW.

Brodhead received \$2,501-\$5,000 in rent from a dwelling he owns in Detroit and from \$5,001-\$15,000 in dividends, interest and capital gains from a dependent child's trust fund.

He was reimbursed for air fare for a trip to the Council of State Housing Agencies.

Brodhead claimed one liability — the mortgage on his single-family house, which he said was valued in the \$15,001-\$50,000 bracket.

He serves on the Ways and Means Committee.

REP. DAVID BONIOR, D-Mt. Clemens, received only \$225 in honorariums from Johns Hopkins University and the New York Times.

He was reimbursed for transportation, five nights of lodging and meals while he went on a "fact-finding trip" to Taiwan University.

He serves on the House Rules Committee.

REP. JAMES BLANCHARD, D-Pleasant Ridge received more than \$5,600 in honorariums.

Most of the fees were \$1,000 and came from the National Association of Homebuilders annual meeting, the Securities Industry Association Conference, the North Carolina Savings and Loan Association annual meeting, the New Jersey Banking and Financial annual meeting, the "National Journal" International Investors Conference, the Budd Co. five-year planning meeting and the Michigan Association of Counties annual meeting.

Blanchard was reimbursed for air travel and lodging at the annual meetings of the National Association of Homebuilders and the Michigan Association of Counties.

He sits on the Banking, Finance and Urban Affairs Committee and the Science and Technology Committee.
