

Jerusalem Marketplace recreated for youth in vacation Bible school

Members of Nardin Park United Methodist Church will use the church and its grounds for "Jerusalem Marketplace," a vacation Bible School which will run from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Aug. 9-12.

Teachers and mothers from the congregation will use the same format as they used last year with the theme "The Twelve Tribes." The theme this summer is "The Twelve Disciples."

Pre-registration is necessary. It runs July 25-Aug. 4. Youngsters from kindergarten through sixth grades may be enrolled by coming to the church office on 11 Mile Road, west of Middlebelt Road.

Shelley Gilmer, who is co-chairing the week of activities with Mada Briggs, said, "The children will all be wearing costumes of the era and will be divided up into family groups. It is all a part of learning about life in Jerusalem 2,000 years ago."

Fee is \$2.50 per child with a maximum of \$5 per family. A permission slip signed by a parent will be requested at the time of registration. This will allow the child to attend the field trips.
