The co-sponsors have arranged for a Magic Walk, professional clowns, face painting and magic shows for Fun Day.

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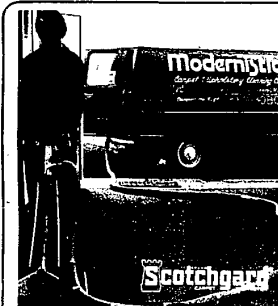
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
