

Work outlines position on income tax, utility rate increases

Either completely eliminate the tax and replace it with a tax that is concurrent with our economic situation in Michigan or amend its language to that of current conditions which will encourage business and jobs.

Q-How will you vote if an equal rights amendment comes before the Congress and Legislature again? Why? How do you feel about the enactment of an equal rights amendment to the state constitution?

Yes, because I believe in equal rights for all people.

An equal rights amendment to our state constitution would be one small step for Michigan and one giant step for our nation's equality.

It should be noted here that Michigan was supportive of the Equal Rights Amendment before its national demise.

However, an amendment to our state constitution would again put Michigan in the leader column.

Q-Why did you agree/disagree with the six-month, 1-percent increase in the state personal income tax voted in last May?

Crisis management was the cause, and I was not surprised. We all know that without saving a little for emergencies, we need to borrow money when an emergency occurs. Unfortunately, the Milliken administration botched it again, therefore, it was necessary for the 1-percent increase in the state personal income tax. The only way for Michigan residents to save for a possible emergency in the future is to vote Democratic on Aug. 10.

Q-Our state and federal road system

has reached maturity in the last few years and rapidly is deteriorating. What programs should be implemented to restore the roads?

Gasoline tax should be earmarked solely for the maintenance and improvement and safe managing of our roads.

Q-SEMTA has experienced a 20-percent cut in its operating budget and expects more cuts as federal aid shrivels. How should the public-transit operating funds question be addressed?

Subsidizing SEMTA is fine when there is a thriving economy. Michigan is not thriving at this time, therefore, our priorities must be to our failing industry, our small businesses, jobs for our people and educational funding. After these areas have been properly ad-

ressed then we should address the mass-transit issue and subsidizing SEMTA.

Q-Do you support a) the "human life amendment" prohibiting abortion? b) Medicaid funding of abortions?

a) No. b) No.

Q-Utility rates have been adjusted automatically for fuel price changes. How do you feel about requiring state Public Service Commission approval of such rate changes?

If the Public Service Commission members were elected by the people, I would support a requirement for approval by the commission for any rate changes.

Q-The State Troopers Association is

seeking a constitutional amendment to guarantee job levels and freeze ranks. How would you vote, and why?

I would not support such a constitutional amendment because through the democratic process the people control and determine the operating needs of the Michigan State Police Department. If Michigan were to double in number

of residents in one year, the number of trooper requirements and leadership requirements would necessarily vary. It is the function of the people and their representatives and not the State Troopers Association or the Constitution to make this determination of job levels and leadership needs in Michigan.

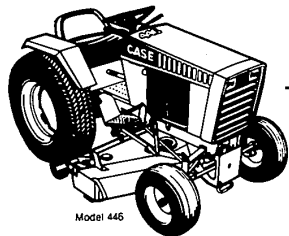

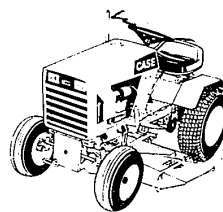

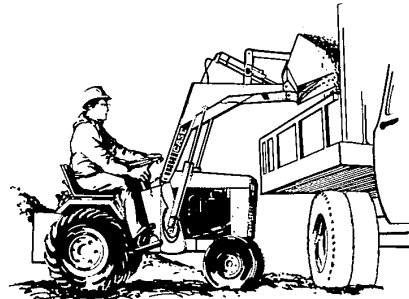
