Hall, 44, now thinks he "bit off more than I could chew, but I'm a real alternative for the Republicans," he said. "People ought to be telling the repre-

sentative how to vote, not the reverse," he said, adding that he thinks representatives ought to stay in their districts full-time and vote electronically there instead of going to Washington.

"That would take away the political intermingling, the rubbing off with lobbyists," he said.

HALL STRONGLY believes in the proposed constitutional amendment for a balanced budget.

"Congress can't balance the budget alone. They've proved it. They've tried," he said, adding that the budget should be balanced "even if it hurts, even if it takes more taxes."

Areas that Hall said ought to be looked at include retirement for government employees, Social Security, ADC and other entitlement programs. "They were up 11 percent last year, and we can't afford that," added Hall, who says his support is mostly coming from friends and neighbors.

Hall also would like to take a look at defense spending.

"As an outsider looking in, I'd like to look at other means of defense. Defense is fine, but it seems like we have more offense than defense," he said.

"Of course, I'm just one vote," he added. "I don't know the inner workings of the House of Representatives,

but my approach would be to form a coalition of all Michigan representatives so we could work together whether Democrat or Republican." Hall believes that Michigan's economic problems are all related to interest rates and unemployment. He said he would like to see Michigan legislators actively working to bring more business into Michigan by calling on prospective business owners.

AS A Congressman, Hall said he would be "more of a wave-maker than Broomfield. I'm a doer. If there's something to do, I go to it. That's probably my best qualification."

He adds that he is a self-starter and not a politician. "I owe no one," he said. "I'll try to stay away from Washington lobbyists and Washington society and behind-the-scenes life. I don't like large groups and parties."

Hall said he's been conducting his campaign by handing out literature and telling people to vote.

"It's so sad how few vote in the primary," he said.

Broomfield discusses hopes for future

"In the broad spectrum, the only thing we can do is to continue to get interest rates down so the auto industry and others will improve," he said.

"We've got to get them down if we're going to keep the economy moving," he said, adding that he "obviously wasn't happy with the decisions and tight money policy of the Federal Reserve Board."

Broomfield said he has sponsored a bill, now stuck in the Ways and Means Committee, that would provide a \$1,500 tax credit for anyone who buys a car this year. He said the move would be an incentive to buy more new cars. Broomfield also favors "impressing

on the Japanese that car sales are a two-way street. We need equal treatment on both sides. Right now it's difficult for American manufacturers to sell their cars in Japan."

"I do favor free trade," Broomfield added. "Our country needs to develop its foreign markets."

Broomfield said he has supported a constitutional amendment that would require a balanced budget.

"It sets a goal to get Congress working within its means," he explained. He said that further cuts in the federal budget would have to be made on a selective basis.

"There are no recommendations I could make on where to cut. There is still room for cutting, but you can't take a meat axe to the budget," he said.
