

Bloomfield Surf soars to another NSSL title

Bloomfield Hills is hundreds of miles from the nearest ocean, but the Surf's always up right about now in the northwest Detroit suburb.

Bloomfield Surf Club is an age-group swimming team, one of the strongest in the suburbs. And come August coach Mike Lane's collection of young athletes usually are celebrating after winning another Northwest Suburban Swimming League championship.

This August was no different than the last six. Bloomfield Surf won the NSSL title by scoring a whopping 789 points to top the 16-team field in the league meet last weekend at Southfield's Beech Woods Recreation Center.

Second-place Birmingham Woodside Athletic Club, coached by Scott Tyler, was more than 100 points poorer with 684, and Rochester Heart of the Hills finished third with 521.

"We're a very organized group with fantastic parent support," said Lane,

explaining Surf's success over the years, "and I think the fact that I've been there 14 years has a lot to do with it, too."

"They (the swimmers) know what to expect from me. They don't have to adjust to a new coach every other year."

One reason for this year's success was Surf's 9-10-year girls, who won three of the four events in that group. Natalie Kroovand notched Surf's only record by going 40.72 in the prelims of the 50-meter breaststroke for 9-10-year-old girls. Other Surf 9-10 girls winners were Angie Torrie (40.59 in the 50 backstroke) and Molly Blank (32.13 in the 50 freestyle).

ANOTHER KEY Surf swimmer was Lynn Jaworski, who won the girls' 11-12 50 butterfly with a time of 29.40. Bill Bertoneci provided another Surf first by winning the 13-14 50 breaststroke in 34.22, and teammate Lori Elliott finished first in the 15-17 backstroke in 32.36.

Bloomfield Surf may have won the

team title, but it had certainly no monopoly on swimming talent.

Troy's Beach-Wood Recreation team had an outstanding older swimmer in Kim Neeb. She won the 15-17 50 breaststroke (36.09) and the 100 individual medley (1:10.13).

Scott Christie, swimming in the 13-14

group for Southfield's Cranbrook Swim Club, established a meet record in the 100 IM (1:03.6) and finished first in the 50 butterfly (28.85).

The Village Athletic Club in Lathrup Village had a top-notch swimmer in Mike Vetter. Swimming in the 11-12 group, Vetter smashed a league record

in the 50 butterfly (31.06) and also won the 100 IM (1:13.21).

Farmington Beechview's Andy Filizpatrick won two events — the 25 backstroke (21.55) and the 25 freestyle (17.11) — in the youngest (7-8) age group. Another Farmington-area youngster, Woodbrooke Hills' Karrie Kraus, was a pal in the same group. She set a record in the 25 butterfly (18.30) and won the 25 backstroke (20.25).

Heart of the Hills had a double winner in Kelly Smyles, who took the girls' 13-14 50 butterfly (30.38, a league record) and the 100 IM (1:10.01).

OTHER LEAGUE records were established by Heart of the Hills's Army Proctor (34.45 in the 11-12 50 back), Cranbrook's Bill Zeitz (32.18 in the 15-17 50 breast), Allison Gowing (34.80 in the 9-10 50 fly), Livonia's CB's Jeremy Findley (40.76 in the 9-10 50 breast) and Woodside's 40-year girls' freestyle relay (59.63).

Bloomfield Surf's chances for a seventh straight championship look good, according to Lane.

"We're certainly going to be one of the favorites for next year," he said. "We're losing only two kids. We're losing a 17-year-old boy and a 17-year-old girl, who only swim on a relay."

cross country teams and now works with computers for the Burroughs Corp. in Haslett.

"It's a nice neighborhood race. The race is also well-organized and that makes a big difference as far as being able to enjoy it."

Melanie Decker, a 21-year-old senior-to-be at Western Michigan University, came all the way from Vicksburg near Kalamazoo to run in the Festival Fox Trot.

And Decker, who holds WMU's 10,000-meter track record (38:59), was rewarded with a first-place finish in the 10-kilometer race with a time of 37:34.

"I was pleased to win," she said. "When I get so far from home I never know how tough the competition's going to be."

Two hundred runners registered on the day of the race, according to YMCA officials. Farmington Hills Mayor Jack Burwell fired a starters' pistol to begin the races.

In order to renew the five (5) mill operating tax increase which expires in 1982, shall the limitation on the total amount of general ad valorem taxes which may be imposed for all purposes in any one year upon real and tangible personal property in the Farmington Public School District, Oakland County, Michigan, be increased as provided in Section 6, Article IX, of the Constitution of Michigan, for a period of ten (10) years from 1983 to 1992, both inclusive, by five (5) mills on each dollar (\$5.00 per \$1,000) of assessed valuation of property as finally equalized, for the purpose of defraying a part of the operating expense of the school district?
