that could use some light shown on their efforts. The idea for the directory was born.

"There are any number of people that do things at home by their own choice," Share says. "They want to be home to work, but not full-time or their occupation is best accomplished in the home setting."

For Levin, Burton and Frumlin, the project sounded interesting and stimulating. "It has a very positive connotation," says Levin.

Burton says people call Home Work, Inc. to inquire whether they have a listing for a certain product or service even now, before publication.

"We can recommend a calligrapher for invitations who has two young children and works in a home studio or someone to do special tutoring for a learning disabled child," she says.

"We've limited it to services or a product they make themselves. We avoid people who wholesale. Actually, I don't think any one of the four of us is looking for a full time job just as our clients aren't."

SEVERAL months ago, they sent out a mailing to about 500 entrepreneurs, asking them to list their business for \$25 in the directory.

"Though the response was not so great, we know this particular directory does something else for women," Share says. "It gives them the incentive to do something. It's a new way to start a business."

Levin says the partners have learned a great deal about marketing, printing, and design. "We went to a Southfield meeting of the National Alliance of Home Based Women and when we mentioned the directory, they applauded," she says.

If the guide doesn't get enough takers and is not published, the \$25 paid by the listers will be returned. "That money is in escrow until we begin actual production," Burton says.

Brandeis book sale — volumes of value

From mystery maven to rare-book collector, book lovers are expected to flock to Tel-Twelve Mall in Southfield Sept. 1-7.

The occasion is the 21st annual used-book sale sponsored by the Brandeis University National Women's Committee, greater Detroit chapter.

Whether you collect books on clocks and are missing just one volume or just need reading fodder to feed your habit, you can bargain buys according to the book-sale coordinators, Josephine Mel-

ten and Estelle Robinson of Southfield and Shirley Goldman of Bloomfield Hills.

Flora Jane Winton of Birmingham is president of the group.

A preview night is scheduled from 9:30 p.m. to midnight Wednesday, Sept. 1, for which a \$3 admission is charged. Advance tickets for the preview may be purchased from Brandeis volunteers at Tel-Twelve Wednesday afternoon.

There is no admission charge for the remainder of the sale through Sept. 7.

Winton said the book sale is a community service since it affords the public an opportunity to buy books at prices which are great values and is a gold mine for collectors.

Brandeis Women customarily recycle books to organizations, schools, community groups, pensioners, senior citizens and hospitals.

Teachers are notified to attend the sale and select books at no charge on

the final day. Nonprofit organizations also will be invited to the final day to make choices at no charge.

Primary beneficiary is the libraries at Brandeis University, a nonsectarian, nonprofit institution in Waltham, Mass.

Work on the 1982 sale began in September, with volunteers gathering books at the Brandeis Book Store, a storehouse and workshop.

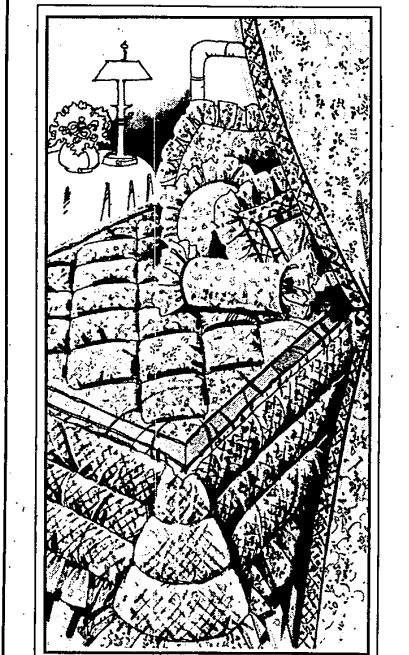
