COMPREHENSIVE FACILITIES PLAN FOR POLLUTION CONTROL FACILITIES IN THE EVERGREEN-FARMINGTON SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN

Notice is hereby given that the Oakland County Drain Commissioner will conduct a public hearing on September 30, 1982, at 7:00 P.M., E.D.T. at the Bloomfield Township Hall, 4200 Telegraph Road, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan. The purpose of the hearing is to present the facilities plan for sewer system improvements and solicit oral or written comments on the plan and environmental effects of the proposed alternatives from interested persons and agencies.

The facilities planning area includes all or part of the following communities within the Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal District: the Cities of Troy, Bloomfield Hills, Birmingham, Lathrup Village, Sylvan Lake, Orchard Lake Village, Farmington Hills, Farmington, Keego Harbor, and Southfield; the Townships of Bloomfield, West Bloomfield, and Pontiac; and the Villages of Beverly Hills, Bingham Farms, and Franklin.

The facilities plan contains alternative solutions to correct existing water pollution problems, to relieve basement flooding, and to provide for additional sewer capacity for on-going development in the District. The plan includes estimates of cost and assessments of the environmental impacts of the proposed facilities.

CHUCKING THE SHIP for a job with Ford's in England, Magee used his experience building fighter planes to become a skilled tradesman in the automotive industry. He came to the United States in 1963.

As much as he enjoys coaching the Angels, Magee has become frustrated with one aspect of amateur sports — raising funds and finding sponsors.

"I've been to places (around Farmington) and they'll say, 'But we already sponsor these softball teams.' And I'll say, 'Have you got a winning team?' And they'll say, 'They win some.' And I'll say, 'Well, we win them all.'"

"I don't know . . . I guess soccer is just too unusual for them."

The players used their own money to attend two tournaments, the Robbie Tournament in Toronto and the United States Soccer Association Regionals in Cleveland, this summer.

In the big international Robbie Tournament, the Angels made the semifinals before losing. Magee's team won the Cleveland tourney, posting a 3-0 victory over Ohio North Ukrainian in the final.

Most of the Angels' regular-season games were played on Sunday nights at Livonia's Schoolcraft College, picked because of its well-maintained fields.

The team received permission from the Farmington Public Schools to practice at the Warner Middle School.

Magee would like the Angels to participate in the Schoolcraft Soccer Fest on Sept. 25. Lack of funds could be a problem, however. The girls have held one car wash to raise money, and they plan to hold another one soon.

Magee hates to see the season end. "I get the biggest kick out of following these girls around," he said. "They really keep me young. You'll find out what I mean when you get to be 60."
