

Harbinger lists dance classes at OCC this fall

Harbinger Dance Company, now entering its second year as artists-in-residence at Oakland Community College, will be offering a variety of classes at OCC's Orchard Ridge Campus this fall.

For the skilled dancer, Harbinger's artistic director and resident choreographer, Lisa Nowak, will teach intermediate and advanced modern technique classes two evenings weekly.

Thomas Morrell, soloist with Harbinger and graduate of the University of Michigan dance department, will be

teaching modern and jazz for beginners. Peggy Levine, Harbinger's jazz instructor, will return from New York later in the fall to teach beginning and intermediate jazz classes.

Ballet for all levels will be offered by a variety of instructors including Harbinger's Susan Clayton.

Of special interest for parents of young children will be Harbinger's "Happy Saturdays" program. Nowak will be teaching the "Come Dance With

Me" class in creative movement for children as well as modern dance for young people. Also scheduled will be beginning ballet for children and tumbling.

HARBINGER's program at OCC will now be under the direction of Nowak and, as the company enters its second year in residence, she and the Harbinger faculty have plans for the further development of dance at OCC.

In addition to the classes offered by

Harbinger, the company plans a series of lunch time mini-concerts in its spacious facility at the college, as well as a student recital and a full concert by the faculty in OCC's new performing arts center.


