

Woman slips out of shoe, tumbles down hill in park

Brenda Gay Wrinn was entering Farmington City Park with her husband and three daughters Thursday morning when one foot slipped out of her shoe. She tumbled head first down a hill in the busy park.

Farmington police said they found Wrinn lying face up in the parking lot near Power and Shiawassee but could see no injuries.

Wrinn told officers she fell "end over end" down the incline and had no feeling from the waist down.

The ambulance crew that arrived shortly afterward said Wrinn showed signs of pain in the stomach and left arm. They took her to Botsford General Hospital, where she was treated and released.

"It was kind of sandy, and my foot slipped right out of my shoe," Wrinn said. "I slipped into a dive and my head knocked against a tree. I was shook up, and in a lot of pain."

Wrinn's husband, Frank, and daughters Jennifer, Danae, and Amy were walking ahead of her and did not see her fall.

"They (the hospital staff) gave me X-rays and therapy for my back all day (Thursday)," she said. "I'm pretty bruised and have a bad sprain."
