Young activists at Clarence-ville High are expected to carry to the board of education Thursday night an appeal chal-lenging administration refusal to recognize their Student Mobilization Committee (SMC).

Principal Anthony Marra vetoed formation of an SMC club in the school after it was granted conditional approval by the Student Council.
