Hearing On Township's First PRD Delayed

FARMINGTON — The Farmington Township Planning Commission has delayed its public hearing on the township's first application for a Planned Residential Development (PRD).

Action was taken at a recent planning commission meeting at the request of one of the developers, Marvin Rollins. The public hearing on the rezoning will be May 28.

DEVELOPERS HAVE requested zoning for a PRD in the area southeast of the intersection of 14 Mile and Drake Rd.

The new PRD zoning, passed last fall, permits an optional mixture of types of residential units. Multiple dwelling units, attached single-family townhouses, all for sale at prices beginning at \$40,000.

Deleted from the zoning request was acreage bordering

two existing subdivisions and a small area of business zone.

The developers made the changes at the request of the planning commission, but only a tie-breaking vote by the commission's chairman prevented the project from being killed.

IN OTHER ACTION the commission unanimously recommended a zoning change to permit a funeral home to be built on 12 Mile between Parkhill and Kerdallwood.

The property would be changed to another classification with other zoning if approved by Township Trustees.

L.D. McCabe petitioned for the change. McCabe operates funeral homes on Grand River in northwest Detroit.

The commission also recommended to the Township Board derived of a preliminary plat for an area south of 13 Mile between Hulstead and Drake Rds.

John Migut, developer, submitted the plat for approval so improvement work

could be continued on the land. No homes can be built on the property until sewer and water connections are available.

The commission urged Migut to seek a special permit to level hills and fill low territory rather than use the authority granted by a preliminary plat.

Clarenceville High Activists Appeal

Young activists at Clarenceville High are expected to carry to the board of education Thursday night an appeal challenging administration refusal to recognize their Student Mobilization Committee (SMC).

Principal Anthony Marra voiced formation of an SMC club in the school after it was granted conditional approval by the Student Council.

The young people had a meeting scheduled late Monday with Supt. David McDowell.

The students say their purpose is to seek an end to the war in Vietnam and to ensure student rights. Their group is part of a larger organization of the same name whose "High School Bill of Rights" lists, among other things, that "students have the right to refrain from saluting the flag."

Dr. Martin Wechsler, president of the Clarenceville board, said he would await McDowell's report before commenting on the situation at length.

The board, to his knowledge, has never laid down a flat policy on student political action clubs. Dr. Wechsler said, and he feels "a fair and consistent policy for all groups, applied even-handedly," should be developed.

THE STUDENT co-chairmen, Andy Sugar and Randy Strachen, in a position paper placed in teachers' mailboxes, said:

"It is the function of this committee to organize students against the war in Viet-

nam and to being students together for a complete understanding of their rights."

"The Prophet" quoted Strachen as saying that the Student Mobilization Committee is not affiliated with any outside organization.
