Actor Yul Brynner is named in a suit awinter acking \$55,000 damages and costs on behalf of a bandicapped young woman workings to be the suit of the suit was find Friday in Wayne County Circuit Court on behalf of Jane Abler, 21-year-old resident of the Plymouth Center for Human Development, Altorney Roman J. Stevens of the Michigan Protection and Advocacy Service for Developmentally-Disabled Citizens, Inc. filed the suit.

In a press conference at the Plymouth facility, Stevens described Abler are not retarded? but victim of a condition like cerebral palsy, characterized by poor motor control and lack of intelligible speech.
"The suit was filed under the Michigan Handicappers Civil Rights Act," she said.

The at provides a person "shall not deep an individual the full and equal enjoyment of the . . . advantages and accommodations of a place of public accommodations or public services because of a handicap that is unrelated to the individual's ability to utilize and benefit "form such services".

"We contend Jane acted appropriately," said Steven.

The manager, the suit continues, "in-dicated that if the plaintiff was not re-moved Yul Brynner would not perform and 'somebody would be embarrassed.'

The action was said to have caused
the "embarrassment, humiliation, loss
of self-respect and mental distress."

Jane Abler's handlcap was listed in the suit as quadriplegic rotary athetoid due to anoxia at birth."

THE THEATER incident was dis-cussed by participants at the press con-ference as well as in the legal docu-

ment.
Ebling pointed out that visits into the community are common for the residents still in the center. These made them better able to enter community life later and enhance their life while they are here," he noted.

The suit said the incident caused Abler to become ill, and she was treated by a Plymouth center physician. She still gets angry when she reads anything about the actor or the show, the suit added.

THE ADVOCACY service, said Bauer, is one mandated by both state and federal laws and funded with money from both levels. Independent of Michigan's Mental Health Department, it represents the handicapped in matters both legal and non-legal. "Last year we intervened on behalf on the handicapped in more than 3,300 cases, only 30 of which required legal action," she said.
