

Mercy sinks foe

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy opened its dual-meet swimming season on a successful note with a 73-53 win over Catholic League foe Birmingham Marian last week.

Mercy, the perennial Catholic League champs, got a first place performance from its 200-yard medley relay (Marilee Konecny, Jill Andries, Nancy Nehr and Sue Herzog), which led a state-qualifying time of 1:58.1.

Mercy's 400 freestyle relay (Herzog, Tracy Johnson, Saunders and Beth Drolet) also qualified with a winning time of 3:49.2. Two more Mercy winners: Pam Sanders (1:03.9, 100 back) and Andries (a variety record 1:09.6, 100 breaststroke).

Marian's Chris MacMillan won the 200 individual medley (2:18.6) and the 500 freestyle (5:14.7).

Mercy swims next on Friday at home against Dearborn St. Alphonsus. The meet begins at 4 p.m.

FARMINGTON, WINNING four of the 11 events, outswam Farmington Harrison, 64-57, in a non-league meet Thursday.

Farmington's 200-yard medley relay (Smith, Schwane, Catlett and Melli) won with a time of 2:09.7. Melli won the 200 freestyle (2:15.6), Smith finished first in the 50 free (23.0) and McIntosh won the diving event (158.85 points).

Harrison's Linda Waak won two events, the 200 individual medley (2:39.11) and the 100 breaststroke (1:30.3). Teammate Paula King won the 100 backstroke (1:12.1) and the 100 butterfly (1:08.3).

Harrison had two more individual winners in Helen Tucker (6:12.5 in the 500 freestyle) and Nancy Schwedt (1:05.5 in the 100 freestyle). Harrison's 400 free relay (Tucker, Schwedt, King and Shelly Bennett) won in 4:27.0.

Farmington swims next on Thursday, Oct. 7, at home against Plymouth Salem. Harrison hosts Northville on the same night. Both meets begin at 7 p.m.

Regular Meeting

September 27, 1982

Mayer Burwell opened the regular meeting of the City Council of Farmington Hills on September 27, 1982 at 7:30 P.M. Members present were: Burwell, Dolan, Soron, Williams and Wolf. Absent: Lange and Hughes. Others present: City Manager Savage, Assistant City Manager Costick, City Clerk Cairns, City Attorney Bilbeau and City D.P.S. Director Bisell.

Council enacted the Zoning Map Amendment No. C62-285, section 10 SW W. 3.34 acres on North side of 13 Mile, east of Kendallwood Drive, to show RC-2, multiple zoning classification.

Council re-introduced City Code Amendatory Ordinance C-11-82, with amendments.

Council enacted City Code Amendatory Ordinance C-5-82, Coin Operated Amusement Devices.

Council approved the concept of proposed agreement with Bolaford Hospital on transfer of title of the Frank Shaw house and two story Greek Revival house to the Historic District Commission.

Approval was given by Council to Holloway Sand and Gravel Company for refuse disposal contract.

Council set date of October 18, 1982 for Public Hearing on request for vacation of proposed Drake Road right-of-way in section 32.

Council awarded the bid for sewer construction to serve the Baptist Manor Senior Citizen complex at Drake and Freedom Roads.

Council approved payment of easement and right to connect to Farmington Christian Center Sewer.

Gloria Traitel was appointed to Farmington Area Commission on Aging.

Council designated Project District Area for Personnel Management, Inc. (Northwestern-Middlebelt area).

Council appointed Harlem Morris and Donald Meade as outside directors for Personnel Management, Inc.

Council set October 12, 1982 as Public Hearing date for the Rieger Project. (Farmington Interchange Industrial Park).

Council designated Project District Area for Holset Engineering. (34500 Grand River Avenue).

Council appointed James Petre and Daniel Reynolds as outside directors for Holset Engineering Projects.

Council set October 12, 1982 as Public Hearing date for the Holset Engineering Projects.

Council recommended adoption of resolution approving intersection improvements at Nine Mile and Inkster Road.

Traffic Control Order No. 2.E.32.82 for prohibition of all left turns from southbound Caddell into I-64 driveway, was approved.

Council approved response to Oakland County Emergency Services Communications Task Force "911" programs.

Council approved an agreement with the Michigan Department of Transportation and the Drainage Board for the Caddell Road to allow construction of Phase 1 of the Caddell Drain.

NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

The above-named City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County requests the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) to be used for the following project:

STORM DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

To provide storm drainage improvements in the Richland Gardens and other subdivisions bounded by Middlebelt, Salinassee, Colwell and Grand River in Section 36, Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan.

\$125,000

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and, accordingly, the above named City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reason for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

The proposed project will require only minor alterations to the landscape and will not destroy or interrupt natural features of the surrounding environment such as, but not limited to, water courses or wildlife.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, in Oakland County which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request, at the Planning Office between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County to the Planning Office. Such written comments should be received at the Planning Office, 31555 W. Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan 48018 on or before October 30, 1982. All such comments so received will be considered and the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.
