Deficit spending in the county's cafe-teria is being blamed on two things— mismanagement and bigh rent.
Oakland County Commissioner Law-rence Periok, D-Southfield, charges that Glen Dick, central services direc-tor, overhusy supplies.
"The people in charge of operating the business (the cafeteria) are running a business — one which would be ban-krupt if they they owned it," Pernick said.

LAP FIXERIA, in the basement of the court house building, serves em-ployees and the public who are in the building on county business. As of Dec. 31, 1981, records show it had a \$181,971 deficit.
