# Investment advice

Recent fluctuations in the stock market have scared even the most sophisticated investors. But regardless of what happens in the future, here's some advice on how to develop a sound investment

future, here's some advice on how to develop a sound investment strategy.

• Most investors define risk as the possibility of losing the principal. Defined that way, passbook savings would be one of safets forms of investment. In an economy plagued by double-digit inflation, we are all too familiar with the hazards of putting our more in bank savings. Risk should be defined as the possibility of losing the value or purchasing power of investment. Additionally, there is risk in not being able to realize an expected return, known as the opportunity cost.

• As a starter, segregate the funds that you do not need for living expenses and emergencies. This avoids the risk of forced selling in had markets.

Gel-rich-quick schemes are doomed to produce disastrous results. The emphasis should be on investing, or realizing a reasonable rate of return consistent with the risk you take. In early years, buy for the long pull, reinvesting all dividends. In later years, shift to higher dividends and cash payoffs.

Even if you are convinced you have the expertise, time and patience to invest in individual stocks, do not try to engage in stock trading to realize a quick profit. Buy into industries with strong growth potential. Choose companies that have excellent management and strong financial positions. Most such companies double their earnings, net asset values and dividends every five to 10 years. Less than 20 percent of New York Stock Exchange stocks fall into this category. It is a good strategy to avoid cyclical stocks and also those that do not have a good track record.

Put no more than 20 percent in any industry and no more than five to 10 percent in any one company. Another suggestion: Try to learn about the companies in which you invest. Remember that you are an owner and not merely a loaner.

In lowing a stock it is best to remember that you are buying value, which depends primarily upon the future earnings of the company. Therefore, use the price-to-earnings (PFB) ratio as the benchmark for a fair price. Divide the P/E of different stocks by the P/E of the Dow Jones Industrial Average for relative price comparisons. Your broker will help you with these figures.

If you wish to invest in stocks but do not want to do it yourself, mutual funds are your best bet. There are more than 500 mutual funds, exclusive of money market funds. But fortunately a number of services and publications provide fund investment philosophies, cost, fees and measure of performance.


