

# Area horseman prepares for N.J. show

West Bloomfield's Ray Holland and his show-horse Juggernaut will be one of the Michigan representatives at the upcoming horse trials at the Gladstone Training Center in Gladstone, N.J.

The Gladstone Training Center is the training headquarters of the United States Equestrian Team.

The Gladstone Horse Trials — for team competition — is in its second year of operation. It is open to teams representing combined training organizations, such as the Michigan Combined Training Association, at the pre-training and training levels.

Michigan will have two teams en-

tered in the two-day horse trials, which start Saturday.

Besides Holland, the pretraining unit consists of Canton's Kelly Sacksteder (her horse Jeremiah Johnson); Northville's Charles Spera (his horse Gordon Whitefoot); and Lake Orion's Karen Ireland (her horse Sugar Bear).

The training team consists of Jackson's Donna Koch and her horse Apollo; Lexington's Laura Sobell and her horse Honcho's Slow Poke; Kalamazoo's Margaret Spencer and her horse Hard Tack; and Clio's James Purcell and his horse First Class.

Combined training is a three-phased competition and is often referred to as the competition for the all-round horse athlete. The three stages include dressage, cross country and stadium jumping.
