cello concertos were written by non-cellists, the Mayeses recalled a number of cellist composers in history. "Victor Herbert was a composer and cellist," said Mrs. Mayeses of the turn-of-the-century Irish-born American who was best known for musical comedies like "Babes in Toyland." "Yeah, and a darned good cellist, too," her husband agreed. "He wrote

two concertos. It's a good piece," he said of the more popular one. "I played it many years ago with the Philadelphia Orchestra. Gregor Piatagorsky wrote me a cadenza for it." He also cited cellist Gaspar Casado (accent on the "o"), "a great Spanish composer who died about 10 years ago. You don't hear his name much any more, but the stuff he wrote is really good."

Andrew Barnicle, as the virginal Malcolm, and Kevin Zeese as stalwart sons of Duncan. They manage to raise the armies needed to dethrone Macbeth. Carl Schurz is sinister and moving as Ross, who turns up to warn Lady

Macbeth. He moves about cloaked in wisdom and appears out of nowhere, filling in for the unknown murderer who allows Fleance to escape. Tom Maynard is effective as Seyton, Macbeth's servant. The entire cast brings energy to spare to this production, and the combination of Shakespeare's magic language and all these lively actors makes for a rousing evening.

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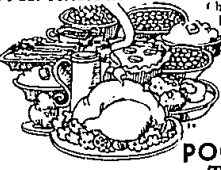
