A Writers and Readers Luncheon begins at 11:30 a.m. Nov. 6 in Botolph Inn.

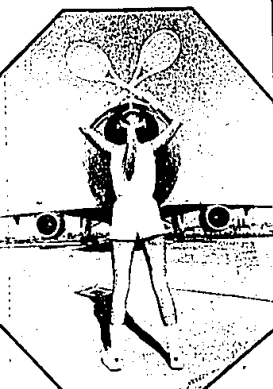
The event is sponsored by the editors of NSN (Not So Neophyte) newsletter, written for the beginners as well as the not-so-neophyte writers.

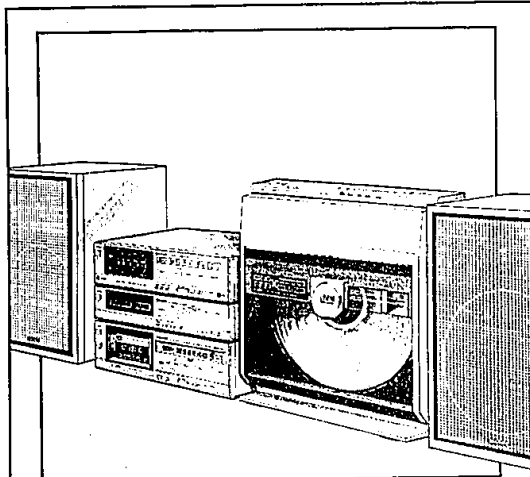
