North clubs Seaholm

Junior Amy Austin scored 21 points Tuesday night to help North Farmington finish its regular season with a 46-24 win over Birmingham Seaholm.

North, which begins state district tournament play on Monday, owns a 16-3 overall record.

Senior center Marla Thompson scored eight points for North, which led by seven points (17-10) at halftime. Mitchell scored 10 points for Seaholm, and teammate Chandler added six.

Captain Greg Grodzicki's Raiders play West Bloomfield at 7 p.m. on Monday in the first game of a Class A district double-header at Walled Lake Central High School.

FARMINGTON HARRISON closed out a successful regular season by beating South Lyon, 74-33. Harrison, coached by Dave Bloom, finished with a 15-4 overall record.

Harrison's Sue Ferguson led all scorers with 24 points, and teammate

Lydia Glyvidis added 18. Alice Short and Dawn Lukomski contributed 14 and 10 points, respectively, for the Hawks.

Three area teams — Lady of Mercy, Harrison and Farmington — will compete in the Class A district tournament at Redford Thurston.

Farmington opens district play on Thursday with a 6 p.m. game against Livonia Bentley. Harrison plays Thurston at 8 p.m. that night.

On Monday, Mercy plays the winner of the Bentley-Farmington game at 6 p.m., and Redford Union meets the winner of the Harrison-Thurston contest at 8 p.m.

FARMINGTON FINISHED a 1-19 season with a 43-33 loss to Redford Union Tuesday. Linda Barbick scored 10 points for Farmington, and Rhonda Lancaster had nine. Kathy Storvik hit 14 for RU, which finished at 3-17.

Asked what he fears most about Harrison, Lakeland coach Keith Griffiths said, "That foot of Blackmer."

Griffiths was referring, of course, to Harrison senior placekicker Dave Blackmer, who kicked a 42-yard field goal against Lahser. Blackmer's seldom off the field, running from the full-back position on offense and playing linebacker on defense.

"With Blackmer they can score any time they cross your 50, so you've got to watch it," Griffiths said.

"Harrison has this tremendous team unity thing where they all pull together and they all feel part of the success," the Lakeland coach added. "They're not a big team, but they certainly play like one."

Lakeland's defense is led by inside linebacker Greg McBride, a 6-1, 195-pound senior who also handles the team's place kicking duties. He made good on a 27-yard field goal in the playoff win over South Lyon.

Junior tackle, Brad Perkins (6-3, 225) and Gary Stehr (6-3, 215), called the Bruise Brothers by their teammates, are also important elements of the Eagles' defense, as is senior-end Steve Spewock (6-3, 155).

Lakeland's secondary, which has intercepted 27 passes, is led by seniors

Darrin Campbell (5-10, 160) and Rodney Elliott (5-11, 170). Both have picked off seven passes this season.

Campbell, the tallback on offense, has gained 622 yards, and senior quarterback Jim St. John has passed for 830 yards and 13 touchdowns.

St. John's favorite receivers are seniors Dave Bendall (6-2, 165), Don Izze (5-7, 145) and Doug Woods (5-10, 170). Together, they've snagged 25 receptions.

"We have a good pass-run mix," Griffiths said. "It's kept them (opponents) off balance so far."

Lakeland's line has some size with tight end Joe Saukai (6-5, 215), center Jim Edelman (5-10, 190) and guards Joe Ciofo (5-10, 190) and Sam Koenig (5-11, 180).
