# Arts and Crafts show on tap

It wasn't so much a question of whether to buy as what to buy as Christmas shoppers armed with their lists jammed the 18th annual Hand and Eye Show Saturday.

And buy they did. Some of the more than 200 exhibitors were nearly sold out by the end of the

exhibitors were nearly sold out by the end of the all-day show. Behind the layers of people were tables filled with Clristmas wreaths made of herbs and dried flowers, hand-sewn Raggety Ann dolls, hand-tooled wooden trucks and trains, brightly-painted children's mirrors, unique hand puppets — more beautiful items and unusual crafts than many shoppers could take in.

More than one shopper was overheard remarking on finding gifts that were "just perfect." for friends and relatives, said Mary Meyer, vice president of the Troy Historical Society which aponors the show. Others were there to find collectibles — folk, art, according to Meyer.

Each year it's reputation has grown, to the point that this year the historical society estimates nearly 10,000 people came by in an eight-hour span. "A long line of people were there longing to get in before 9 a.m.," said Alison Nunney, who handled publicity. "It think people were all very pleased with what was sold."

THE EXHIBIT is Troy's first juried arts and craft show and the fact that exhibitors are screened first has guaranteed quality items and helped build the reputation of the show, said Meyer. She credited its success on the exhibitors. "The success is no credit to us, if you don't have good crafts, people won't come back. They (the crafts people) do absolutely fantautic things. We heard

The fair is a major undertaking which takes nearly nine months to plan. "We started in February this year," said Meyer.


