Alcoholism Education offered in seminary

Alcoholism as a family disease will be the focus of an alcoholism education course in St. John's Provincial Semi-nary, Plymouth, on Thursdays from 220-520 pm. beginning Dec. 9. The course, conducted by Rose Teresa Izzo, may be taken for credit or audit by anyone interested and qualified. Chemical dependency is a wholistic disease affecting the entire family, Sister Izzo said, and unemployment is increasing that dependency, especially alcoholism.

Reflecting on her four-year experience as a counselor in the in-patient Alcoholism Treatment Program at St. Joseph Hospital, Mt. Clemens, Sister Ixzo ild, "It's so important that people in elping services understand the disease

and its treatment in the context of the family.

"In this course, we will identify the symptoms of alcoholism and its effects on the family. We will also learn how to conduct an intervention and find treatment, besides reviewing the dynamics of recovery and reconstruction," the said.

The course will also include student visits to an alcoholic ireatment center and dialogue with a staff person; attendance at an open Alcoholics Anonymous meeting and an Alanon or Alaceen meeting guest tectures, films and process experiences.

About 250 guests are expected at the gathering, which will bonor 91-year-old Idas on 94-year-old Jacob Nosanchuk, who were both born in Ruble, Russia and married there on Nov. 28, 1807.

Two of their children, Rose Raskin, now deceased, and Joseph, now a Pontiare physician, were born in Russia. Another daughler, Ann Meyers, was born later in Detroit.

"My parents still live in their own home in Oak Park," Nosanchuk sald. "My mether, though practically blind, does the cooking, and my father still drives his 1968 blink. His driver's license will expire in 1986."

Among the diamond wedding anniversary guests will be the couple's two children, eight grandchildren, 19 greatgrandchildren and a 10-month-old great-great-granddaughter.

"Their 96-year-old cousin will attend the party, but a 105-year-old cousin from New Yerk won't be able to attend because of ill health," Nosanchuk asid.

JACOB NOSANCHUK immigrated to the United States in 1913 seeking a better life for his family, whom he was forced to leave behind temporarily.

During World War I he filled his life with work and prayer, spending every free hour as a volunteer for war relief organizations.

Meanwhile, his wife and two children struggled for their existence. She worked in the field as a potato digger, with little food, no dectors, living one day at a time, "leaving the rest to God, praying that he would help us," she said.

The couple picked up the threads of their marriage about two years after the war and built their life around a verse from Proverts, "Those who pursue giving charity and good deeds are rewarded with life, wealth, and honor."

On their 'Jard wedding anniversary they made a contribution to the reclamation of one acre of land in Moshav Dishon, Israel, under the auspices of the Jewish National Fund (JNF).

Previous they planted a forest of 10,000 trees on a one-acre site in the Galilice.




They have endowed a room in United Old Ago Home in Jerusalem and a dormitory and classroom in Bar-Ilan University.


