

Seminary will sponsor 'Christmas in Dialogue'

"Christmas in Dialogue," a seminar designed for an ecumenical group, will be offered at St. John's Provincial Seminary, Plymouth, from 7-9 p.m. Thursdays beginning Dec. 9. Mary Ann Hinsdale, IHM, a 1980-81 ecumenical exchange scholar at the University of Tuebingen and a St. John's faculty member, will lead the two-credit course.

Discussion of the official statements from the churches and meeting with members of different denominations will be the focus of course activities. Sister Hinsdale said. Students will also attend a worship in a denomination dif-

ferent from their own during Church Unity Octave in January.

"When people join together on social justice projects or in prayer groups," Sister Hinsdale said, "they experience a kind of spiritual ecumenism. They find that they seem to have more in common with people in other denominations around these issues than with members of their own congregations. This organic experience has provided us with an important new basis for ecumenical endeavors."

"Dialogue also occurs at institutional levels," Sister Hinsdale added, "but it tends to be outside most people's expe-

rience. This course will attempt to bring the organic and the institutional together."

THE COURSE will examine the results of several official dialogues, especially the joint statements of Anglicans, Lutherans, and Disciples of Christ with Roman Catholics. The class will also consider recent developments in Jewish-Christian relations.

Sister Hinsdale became interested in ecumenism through observing how divisions over social issues cut across denominational lines and provide both a new basis and a new set of challenges

for ecumenical dialogue. As a member of the Ecumenical Forum, a national Canadian association, she gave ecumenical workshops, principally on scripture.

A recipient of a grant from the World Council of Churches, Sister Hinsdale is completing her doctorate at St. Michael's College University of Toronto. There she was a student of two prominent North American ecumenists, Gregory Baum and Harry McSorley.
