Deer numbers down; parks ready for winter

Deer hunting conditions in southeastern Michigan are excellent, but the
numbers of deer and hunters are down.
State Department of Natural Resources field officers say hunting pressure is down by half. That may be because of widespread reports that deer
population would be down because of
the severe winter of 1981-2.
Rabbit hunting has been good to excellent this year, and duck hunters on
the lower Detroit River and Lake Erie
had a fine season.

BEFORE LONG, the browning grass will be covered with snow, and area Huron-Clinton Metroparks are gearing up for winter activities.

Stony Creek Metropark, northeast of Rochester, features facilities for win-ter sports, including lee fishing, lee skating, stedding, tobogganing, cross-country skiling and ski rental service.

Ice skating will be available on Stony
Creek Lake at the boat launching site.
The building at the site will serve as a
warming shelter and has heated restrooms and vending machines. Cross
county ski trails dot the park, and a ski
rental service is offered at the Ski
Touring Center. Nature trails are open
year-round.

Because snow and ice conditions vary dally, persons are advised to contact parks before arriving. Phone numbers are: Stony Creek, 781-4242; Metro Beach, 983-022; Kensington, 685-1561; Indian Springs, 981-5865.

There are 12 miles of cross-county ski trails.

KENSINGTON Metropark near Mil-ford is one of the most popular winter playgrounds because it offers facilities for ice skating, tobogganing, sledding, cross-country skiing and ski rental ser-vice, ice fishing, nature hikes and pho-tography. GOOD PERCH lishing can be found at Metro Beach Metropark on Lake St. Clair. Fisherman can use the canals, boat basins, Black Creek and Lake St. cross-county saint and an tent service, ice lishing, nature hikes and photography.
General lee skating and hockey rinks will be on Kent Lake in front of the boat rental building, with a kating bours from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. The building has a heated lounge, Itreplace, restrooms and food service.

Near Clarkston, Indian Springs Metropark, a new 1,648-acre site, will offer cross-country ski trails, sleeding and nature trails. There are no tobegan runs or ski rental facilities.
