Road board asked to back off SEMTA case

The Oakland County Board of Commissioners is urging the county Road Commission to drop its role in Impending lawnit over SEMTA funds.

In a 19-5 vote, the county board adopted a resolution calling for the release of \$31 million in tri-county vehicle license surcharges and title transfer taxes. The money is being held in a special escrow fund pending outcome of litigation involving the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority and the Road Commission.

ABOUT 30 persons, mostly handi-capped, spoke to the board opposing the SEMTA bus cuts. They said they depended on the ser-vice to get to medical appointments

Opposing the resolution were Republican Commissioners Anne Hobart of Pontiac, Paul Kasper of Bloomfield Hills, James Lanni of Royal Oak, Joseph Montante of Orchard Lake and Richard Wilcox of Ortonville.

SEMTA tax halts

Beginning Jan. 1, the \$2.50 Southeast Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) tax for renewing vehicle registrations no longer will be collect-ed in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb countles.

The change is reflected in prepared vehicle renewal applications now being

send 45 days in advance to motorists in three countles. The \$2.50 SEMTA tax along with a \$6 tax on titles have been collected in Wayne, Oakland and Ma-comb countles since 1977. According to Secretary of State Richard Austin, the law establishing both special taxes is scheduled to ex-pire Dec. 31.

If SEMTA prevails in the state Court of Appeals, the Road Commission plans to appeal the decision.

commission to the control to the could use their influence to stop the road commission's appeal.

"We will be appointing a new (road) commissioner next year, and this action (the appeal) is something we should not support. Pernick said.

The money held in was collected from special vehicle taxes charged to Wayne, Oskland and Macomb county residents. The Oskland road board objected to the collections, and Attorney General Frank Kelley ruled that the collections were unconstitutional.

John Grubba, managing director of the road commission, said he intervened because he thought "SEMTA was asking for too much."

WITHOUT the escrowed funds, SEMTA will be forced to cut its services by 60 percent Jan. I. Most cuts will involve SEMTA's connectors and train programs, which serve many handleapped and elderly persons.

Several communissioners opposed the resolution because they favor de-

veloping a transportation service operating only in Oakland County.
"SEMTA is continuing to deter-lorate," said lame duck commissioner Kasper, one of three Oakland members on the SEMTA board.
"We can do it alone. We're going to get less and less, and it's going to cost you more and more. SEMTA is in a crisis situation, and it hasn't changed," he added.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE Daniel T. Murphy supported the board's resolution but also favored having state legislation to pay for the transportation system, rather than relying on tri-county vehicle license surcharges and title transfer taxes.

"This board and I are behind the bus system. We don't want it cut," he told the audience of nearly 500.


