'Miss Dig' fields 2 millionth call

"Miss Dig" has saved hundreds of lives and millions of dollars in property damage since she began operating in Michigan 12 years ago. "Interruption of utility service has been avoided in countless listances," said Michael Digon, executive secre-tary of the program. "Prior to the 'Miss Dig' program, public and private utilities experienced frequent service interruptions caused by eccavators stirking pipes and cable," he added. This week the 'Miss Dig' program massed a milestone by fielding its two-millionth call. Here is how the program works:

ANY CONTRACTOR or private property owner who is planning to ex-cavate, dials "Miss Dig" at least 48 bours before beginning an excavaling job. The contractor gives the operator pertinent information about the planned job, including exact location of the job.

planned job, including exact location of the job. The information is entered into a computer and teletyped to all utilities serving the location.

THERE'S ONLY ONE

Those utilities then stake out their lines with color-coded markers, some-times meeting with the contractor on large jobs to discuss eccavation plans. Assistance may also be provided by an electric utility if equipment is to be used near electric overhead lines. Five Michigan utility companies — Michigan Bell Telephone, Detroit Edi-son, Michigan Consolidated Gas, Gen-eral Telephone and Consumers Power — started "Miss Dig" in November 1970. They have administrative respon-sibility of operating the system. Earlier this year Consumers Power established a subsidiary to take over operations.

"MISS DIG" began with a pllot pro-gram in four townships bordering De-troit and spread rapidly throughout the state. There are now 450 participants in the "MISS DIG" program. An average of 1,000 calls are received each day at the call center in Royal Oak. Fourieren operators have 19 phone lines open. The original telehone number spelled MISS DIG, but the toil free number 1-

800-482-7171 was added to accommo-date the enlire state. At first, only underground telephone, telegraph, gas, electric, water saver enr, Digon said. From 1977-9, "MISS DIG" added coverage of overhead elec-tric lines throughout the state. Recen-ly, "MISS DIG" began taking responsi-bility for underground television cables.
