

Jay swimmers sink Harrison

Southfield won both relays Tuesday in beating Farmington Harrison, 79-47, in a non-league swimming meet.

The Blue Jays' 200-yard medley team (Chris Packala, Jeff Landgraf, Eric Allen and Bill Andrews) won with a time of 1:57.2, and their 400-yard freestyle crew (Rick Wisniewski, Rich Lamphear, Dan Capalunga and Landgraf) posted a winning time of 4:45.6.

Lamphear won the 50 freestyle in 2:5.8, and Andrews took the 100 freestyle in 55.5. Ben Weisner gave Southfield a first in the 100 breaststroke with a time of 1:11.1, and teammate Bob Michael won the diving event with 210.55 points.

Steve Goodman and Tom Rudel were double winners for Harrison.

Goodman won the 200 individual medley (2:23.1) and the 100 butterfly (1:00.7), and Rudel finished first in the 200 free (1:49.8) and the 500 free (4:38.8).

The meet result left Southfield with a 2-1 record. Harrison is 0-1. Southfield has a 7 p.m. meet Thursday at Dearborn Heights Annapolis. Harrison will participate in the Western Lakes Relays at Plymouth Salem Saturday afternoon.

NORTH FARMINGTON fell to Livonia Stevenson, 66-61, in a non-league meet Tuesday. North is 0-2 this season.

Brian Goins of North established a varsity record in the 100 butterfly with a time of 54.6 and also won the 200 IM with a 2:12.2. Teammate Scott

Sinason also won two events, the 200 freestyle (2:50.2) and the 500 free (5:28.7).

North's Scott Manderfield won the 100 breaststroke in 1:06.9 and swam a leg on the Raiders' relay relay team (with Scott Perry, Goins and Chris Heineman), which won in 1:39.45.

North, now 0-2, is inactive until Jan. 6 when it swims at Plymouth Canton.

BIRMINGHAM GROVES, with Dave McAfee winning two individual events and swimming on a winning relay, opened its boys' swimming season on a successful note Tuesday with a 74-53 victory over non-league West Bloomfield.

McAfee was tops in the 200 IM (2:07.2) and the 500 free (4:58.0) and combined with Kurt Leffer, Darin Stoddard and Roark VanDien to win the freestyle relay in 3:24.4.

Other Groves firsts: Leffer (1:58.4 in the 200 freestyle), James Webster (58.33, 100 backstroke) and Mike Cloutier (258.20 points, diving).

West Bloomfield's Jerry Misset was a double winner with times of 22.84 in the 50 free and 50.97 in the 100 free. He also swam on the Lakers' medley relay (with Mark Wittenberg, Tim Liu and John Berry), which won in 1:49.3.

Wittenberg won the 100 butterfly in 58.3, and Liu finished first in the 100 breaststroke in 1:05.3.

Groves will swim in the Troy Athens Relays Saturday. West Bloomfield, which sports a 1-1 record, will host Ulica Elsenhorst Jan. 6.

Gift-bearing CC rips Lansing '5'

You could say Detroit Catholic Central played the socks off of non-league basketball foe Lansing Eastern Tuesday night.

The Shamrocks, who presented small gifts to the Eastern players during the player introductions, were less charitable during the 32 minutes of non-stop action, racing to a 75-65 win.

"It's been my tradition for 25 years," explained CC coach Bernie Holowicki. "We pick one game before Christmas and give our opponent something."

"We gave them socks this time."

The unbeaten Shamrocks broke away from a 32-32 halftime deadlock by scoring eight unanswered points at the outset of the third quarter to take control.

"Eastern, which came into the game with a win over Southfield and a loss to highly touted Lansing Everett, never came closer than six points the rest of the way."

SOPHOMORE SHARPSHOOTER John McIntyre riddled Eastern's zone defense for 23 points. Most of the shots he made were beyond 18 feet. He had

19 and 21 points in CC's first two outings.

"Mac" can hit," said Holowicki. "He's smart — a gym rat. He stayed with it. I'm pleased with his play because he's only a sophomore, but I hope everyone don't expect too much. Like everybody he'll have his bad games, too."

The rest of the CC cast also played well.

Guard Stan Heath, who did a masterful job directing CC's attack, added 17 points, five assists and five steals. Kevin Kral, playing his first game thus far, tallied 16 and 11 points, respectively.

"CC is well-organized both offensively and defensively," said Eastern coach Paul Cook, who guided the Quakers two years ago to the state Class A title.

"They seemed to know what they were doing all the time. They executed on both ends."

Vernon Norris, a 6-4 sophomore, paced the Quakers with 15 points. Seniors Don Bentley and Terrill Stanley added 14 and 13, respectively.

"THE KEY is that we started out very aggressively in the second half," said Holowicki. "We got eight points in about a minute."

In the 126-pound bout, Farmington's Kevin Dearth pinned Tony Grey in 3:21. It took Farmington's Rob Anglin 1:20 to pin Dave Abella in the 132-pound

match. David Cunningham of Farmington pinned Scott Bender in 59 seconds at 145, and Ab Johnson won the 167 match for Farmington with a pin in 1:15 over Dan Johnson.

Groves won five matches. Scott Martinez took the 138 bout with a pin in 2:44 over Mike Rometty. Mike Niles at 155, pinning Jim Horn in 2:19. Ken Sedeno needed 47 seconds to pin Mike Sulek. Scott Taylor used 31 seconds to pin Dan Parillo, and Mike Basso pinned Scott Peterson in 1:23.

The only non-pin came at 112. Farmington's Darrell Tharnish won on a

void.

Farmington, now 1-2, is home to Livonia Stevenson on Thursday.

Terry Donovan of North won the 105-pound match, pinning Dan Johnson in

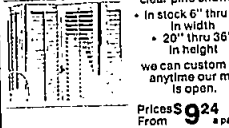

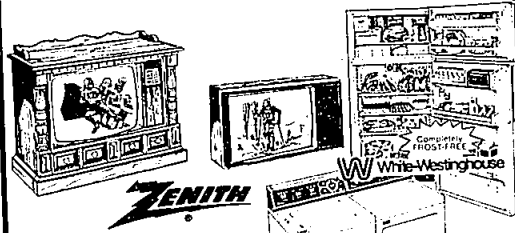
