

Farm'ton tankers suffer first defeat

Farmington High dropped its first meet of the season when Wayne Memorial overpowered the Falcons, 70-57, and evened their record at 1-1.

Randy Gallinger and Alec Campbell each won a pair of events to pace Farmington in the losing effort. Gallinger captured the 200-yard freestyle in 1:54.6 and then came back to win the 500-yard freestyle in 5:13.3.

Campbell won the 200-yard individual medley in 2:05.5 and set a new Wayne Memorial pool record when he won the 100-yard butterfly in 1:51.1.

Jay Weaver was the only other winner for the Falcons with a 1:03.4 effort in the 100-yard backstroke while Chris Edwards set a new varsity record when he swam the 50-yard freestyle in 22.9 for second place.

Next action for Farmington is Jan. 11 when the Falcons host Dearborn Edsel Ford at home.

Southfield wrestlers squeeze past Kimball with heavy victories

Southfield's Larry Langer recorded his 12th straight match victory Thursday to help the Blue Jays outwrestle Royal Oak Kimball, 34-33, in a Southeastern Michigan Association meet.

Langer, a senior, won the 185-pound battle by pinning Kimball's Todd Nagelvoert in just 43 seconds. Larry's younger brother Brian won the 167-pound match with a pin of Kevin Wicklund in 56 seconds.

In the heavyweight bout, Southfield senior John Karar defeated defending league champion Terry Pounds, 15-1. Dan Siporin, a Blue Jay junior, pinned Dave Neary in 1:37 in the 145-pound match.

Southfield, now 7-4 overall and 2-1 in the conference, hosts Berkley at 6:30 p.m. Jan. 6.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the cost of the Caddell Drain, to serve areas in the City of Novi, the City of Farmington Hills and the City of Farmington, has been tentatively apportioned as follows, to wit:

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that the Drainage Board for the Caddell Drain, will meet at 1:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on Wednesday, the 28th day of January, 1983, in the office of the Oakland County Drain Commissioner, Public Works Building, 1 Public Works Drive, Pontiac, Michigan, for the purpose of hearing any objections to the said apportionments.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that the plans, specifications and estimates of cost of said Caddell Drain and also, a description of the area to be served thereby are on file in the office of the Oakland County Drain Commissioner, Public Works Building, 1 Public Works Drive, Pontiac, Michigan. The said estimated cost is \$3,500,000, but the apportionment percentages as finally established by the Drainage Board shall apply to the actual cost of said drain when finally completed.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that all hearing any public corporation to be assessed, or any taxpayer thereof, will be entitled to be heard.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that after consideration of all objections to the apportionments the Drainage Board shall determine whether the apportionments fairly reflect the benefits to accrue to each public corporation and the extent to which each public corporation contributes to the conditions which make the drain necessary. If the Drainage Board determines that the apportionments are equitable it will enter a Final Order of Apportionment confirming the apportionments. Section 483 of Act No. 40, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, provides that the Final Order of Apportionment shall not be subject to attack in any court, except by proceeding as provided brought within 30 days after the order is filed in the office of the Oakland County Drain Commissioner, the Chairman of the Drainage Board for the Caddell Drain, and that if no such proceedings shall be brought within said 30 day period the legality of the assessments for the drain shall not thereafter be questioned in any suit at law or in equity, either on jurisdictional or non-jurisdictional grounds.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that if the Drainage Board enters the Final Order of Apportionment a special assessment roll assessing the estimated cost of the drain will be prepared and presented to the Drainage Board for approval. The Drainage Board then intends to issue bonds of the Caddell Drainage District in anticipation of the collection of installments of said assessments and the interest thereon. Each public corporation assessed is obligated to levy sufficient taxes to pay the assessment installments and interest as the same become due unless there has been set aside moneys sufficient therefor.
