Governor saves official's job

In one of his last decisions as governor, William Milliken ruled Thursday that West Bloomfield Township Treasurer Andrew Lobodocky — although guilty of official misconduct — may remain in office.

He placed Lobodocky on probation for the rest of his term which ends November, 1984.

Probation conditions established by Milliken, whose last official day as governor was Friday, are that Lobodocky continue to take Antabuse tablets as required on a weekly basis in the presence of township Supervisor John Doherty or his designee.

Antabuse is a drug causing severe illness if alcohol is consumed.

Brighton Hospital also must report periodically that the treasurer is continuing an alcoholic rehabilitation program.

In June, the township board petitioned the governor to remove Lobodocky from office. It charged that on May 28, following lunch at Darlin' Lil's Restaurant in Farmington Hills, he returned to town hall intoxicated and made obscene sexual advances toward five female township employees.

Doherty's secretary, Joan Lauzon, said the treasurer offered her money for sex, swept the papers off her desk, used vile language, chewed a file folder and banged his head against the wall.

LOBODOCKY DENIES all memory of the incident.

On June 14 he entered the alcoholism program at Brighton Hospital and continued outpatient treatment at the Henry Ford Hospital Alcoholism Center in West Bloomfield.

In October, Milliken appointed former judge George Bashara to hear the charges against Lobodocky and make a recommendation on whether the treasurer should be removed from office.

The five women, West Bloomfield Police Chief Alfred McGhee and Doherty testified as to the treasurer's intoxicated condition.

Brighton Hospital Medical Director Dr. Russell Smith testified Lobodocky was admitted for three weeks treatment for alcoholism.

"We are pleased the governor has determined Mr. Lobodocky's actions constituted official misconduct," township

ship Attorney William Hampton said Thursday.

"It was argued by Mr. Lobodocky through his counsel (Jeffrey Leib) that his actions did not involve his work in the treasurer's office. The governor has ruled in our favor in this regard."

It is Hampton's understanding that if any of the conditions are violated, Lobodocky will automatically be removed from office.

Hampton believes this provides sufficient protection for township employees.

BASHARA, A FORMER Wayne County judge now practicing law with a Detroit law firm, forwarded his recommendation to Milliken's office in November. Bashara declined to release his opinion to anyone but the governor.
