Under the Maintenance of Effort Clause of Public Act 416, state funding will be discontinued if a county cuts its expenditures or the level of its road patrol below 1978 levels.

The number of Oakland County road patrol officers has been raised from 80 to 89.

A letter accompanying the documentation was signed by Murphy and County Commissioner G. William Caddell, R-Walled Lake, chairperson of the county board's finance committee. Caddell acted on behalf of Richard P. Wilcox, chairperson of the board of commissioners.

Murphy sald Sheriff Johannes Spreen refused to sign the letter because the sheriff disagreed with its final paragraph.

IN ITS entirety, the paragraph states: "Since we have not reduced the road patrol, but instead have increased personnel by 11 percent, and expenditures by 76 percent, there can be no doubt about the terms of the 'maintenance of effort' clause being met. We would sincerely appreciate your written

acknowledgement of this fact as soon as possible. Murphy added, "Even without Spreen's cooperation, we are presenting a very strong case to the state, and we intend to light very bard, if necessary, to keep those officers on the job."

The sheriff and the county executive had clashed two weeks carlier, when they falled for seach agreement on a plan to present to the Board of Commissioners to elimantate 17 deputies. The 17 were to be laid off Jan. 1.

Murphy had signed a proposal, but Spreen refused, saying he had some reservations about it and that it was "quite hasty."

Under the proposal, drafted by Murphy's office, Spreen was to convince the command and patrol officers unloss to accept a 6 percent wage increase for 1982 and no increase for 1983. But Spreen said it was not his place to intrude on the bargaining units.
