

Rudolph Steiner's architecture is celebrated

The exhibition, "Architecture and Human Values," opens Jan. 14 and runs through March 6. Featured will be major buildings by Steiner along with examples of architecture from other countries. The exhibit, on international tour, documents Steiner's architectual achievements through original drawings, large format photo murals and clay models of Steiner's major buildings, Goetheanum I and II.

Rex Raab, European architect and author accompanying the exhibit, will be the featured speaker at the all-day conference Jan. 15 at Cranbrook Muse-um Lecture Hall.

Raab will discuss the meaning and influence of Steiner's architecture for current and future practitioners in the fields of art, architecture and design, and he will also give an in-depth tour of the exhibit during the conference.


