

Lathrup clips Andover, 84-48

Four Southfield-Lathrup players scored in double figures Tuesday as the Chargers blunted Bloomfield Hills Andover, 84-48, in non-league basketball.

Scott Shafer, a 6-foot-4 senior forward, led Lathrup with 20 points. Ron Smith followed with 14 points, and Morris Baxter and Darryl Stokes each had 10. Ken Hudson led Andover with nine points.

Curtis Riley, Lathrup's 6-5 center, pulled down nine rebounds to help the Chargers dominate the boards, 25-18. Lathrup shot 65 percent from the field (39 of 60) to Andover's 39 percent (18 of 46).

Lathrup now 3-4 overall, has a Metro Suburban Activities Association game at Birmingham Groves Friday night. Andover, now 0-6, travels to Ferndale for a Southeastern Michigan Association contest on the same night.

BROTHER RICE held sweet-shooting Lew Scott to just eight points Tuesday and surprised Redford Bishop Burgess, 40-39, in the Catholic League Central Bracket basketball opener on Rice's floor.

Scott, a 6-foot-5 forward, has had a hot scoring hand so far this season with

35- and 28-point games and a 25-point average.

"We didn't allow him to have the ball where he wanted it," said Rice coach Nick Conit, after the game.

"But it went beyond holding Scott down. More important, we did not allow Burgess to get into the offense that they showed in previous games. And another thing: we didn't allow the game to become a track meet."

Burgess went to the free-throw line just three times and made two. The losers were 14 for 38 from the field. Rice made 12 of 35 floor shots and 16 of 21 free throws.

Kern Smith and John Henry scored 16 and 11 points, respectively, for Rice, which raced to a 12-point (22-10) half-time lead.

Rice, 3-3 overall, plays Friday night at Warren DeLaSalle.

ORCHARD LAKE St. Mary's suffered its first league loss after 54 straight victories Tuesday, dropping a 47-38 decision to Center Line St. Clement in a Catholic League A-East game in Orchard Lake.

Mike Bayer scored 18 points for St. Clement, which climbed to 4-2 overall and 2-0 in the six-team conference.
