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Financial aid sessions begin

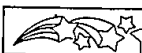
Applying for financial aid for education is one of the most important yet bewildering aspects for college students today.

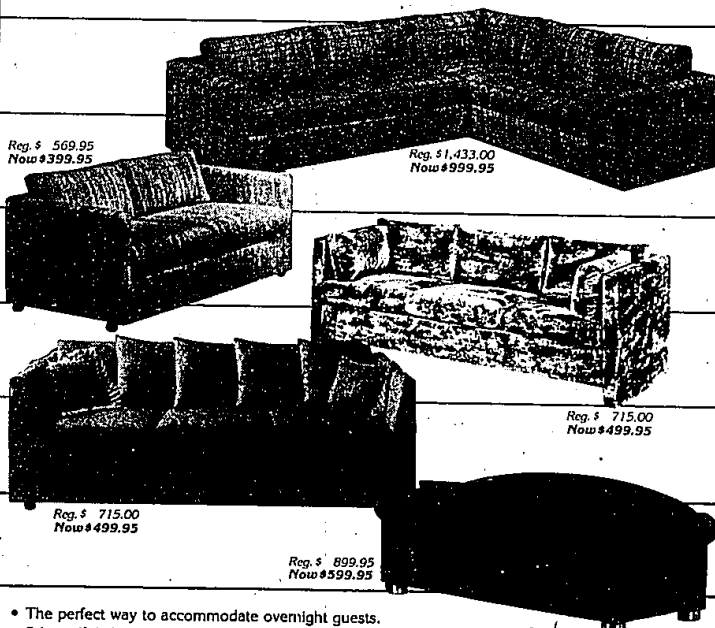
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
