THE MICHIGAN premiere of the film "Ghandi" will be hosted by the Founders Society, Detroit Institute of Arts on Jan. 20 at the Prudential Town Center in Southfield.

Mr. and Mrs. A. Alfred Taubman of Bloomfield Hills are honorary chairpersons of the museum benefit, which begins with a champagne reception at 7 p.m. An afterglow will feature Indian refreshments and open bar.

Tickets to the premiere are available at the Founders Society Membership Office in the art institute, or by calling 833-1454 or 833-7971. Tickets will be limited to 500 persons.

Proceeds from the \$50-per-person donation will be used to fund Founders Society programs including special exhibitions, education, conservation and publications. Donations are tax deductible.

The Columbia Pictures release "Ghandi" has been 20 years in the making by director Sir Richard Attenborough. The film follows 56 of the 79 years of Mahatma Ghandi's life.

"Ghandi" culminates in the funeral procession of 300,000 people. Ben Kingsley, the Anglo-European actor who portrays Ghandi, has won the 1982 New York Film Critics Award for best actor.

The script for "Ghandi" was written by John Briley, a Michigan native who was born in Kalamazoo. A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Michigan, Briley now lives in England.

"Ghandi" lived the most fundamental drama of all: the war between love and hate," Briley said. "He believed in only one victor. I have tried in the screenplay to give back what he has given to me."

"DIVA," a benefit for the Michigan Opera Theatre Guild, will include a 7:30 p.m. Jan. 20 screening of the "Divas" film at the Bloomfield Theatre in Birmingham, then meeting and dancing with the diva herself at Cheeks disco in Detroit.

The evening focuses on Wilhelmina Wiggins Fernandez, opera star of "Divas," the French new wave thriller.

A veteran of the Michigan Opera stage, Fernandez was last heard in Detroit in the 1982 MOT production of "Porgy and Bess" and currently is featured in MOT's "Marriage of Figaro," opening Friday.

The "Divas" evening sponsored by the MOT guild is priced at \$20 per person. Tickets may be purchased at the Michigan Opera Theatre, Cheeks, the Bloomfield Theatre and Birmingham's Discount Record Shop.

David DiChiera, Michigan Opera Theatre general director, said, "I have always believed in Willie's talent, and during her four seasons with us she has truly emerged as an international talent."
