# Briefings must be open, township boards told

When a newspaper reporter finds out city officials are gathering behind closed doors to discuss city-business, she attends the meeting. City officials tell the reporter to leave before the session starts.

Are these city officials violating the state Open Meetings Act, or do they have the right to get together in a closed session for so-called 'staff briefings.'

That question currently is being decided ingham County Circuit Court. The Lansing State Journal filed the lawsuit, charging the Lansing City Council violated the Open Meetings Act by falling to notify the public about the meeting.

"I'm sure they (the city council) are going to lose," said Herbert H. Norton, director of township services for the Michigan Townships Association.

NORTON CITED this example during a lecture about the Open Meetings and Free-

dom of Information laws. It was one of several sessions conducted at the annual MTA convention last week in the liyati Regency, Dearborn. More than 1,500 township officials — some from as far away as Chicals—in the light of th

pewa County in the Upper Peninsula — attended.

Norton's contention is backed by a recent state attorney general's opinion. It says that public bodies can't call meetings, contences or workshops with administrative staffs in order to avoid provisions in the Open Meetings law,

"These presentations of administrators are part of the deliberative process through which decisions on public policies are reached," Atty Gen. Frank Kelley said.

Norion cautioned township officials not hold closed essions' unless it's absolutely necessary.

Closed sessions may be called when a public official or employee who may be dismissed, suspended or disciplined requests a closed hearing, Norton said.

Negotiating collective bargaining agreements

• Considering purchase or lease of property (up to the time an option to purchase or lease is obtained).

Consulting with an attorney about trial or settlement atrategy in pending litigation, but only when an open meeting would have a detrimental financial effect on the litigating position of the public body.
Reviewing an application for employment or appointment to a public office when the candidate requests the application remain confidential. However, all interviews by a public body for employment or appointment to a public office must be held in an open meeting.

NORTON WARNED township officials that violation of the act has steep penalties.

According to the law, a public official who intentionally violates the act is guilty of misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to 21 AM

of misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.

If the official intentionally violates the law twice, he could be fined up to \$2,000 or serve up to a year in jail.

However, most officials only get a "alap on the wrist for violating the law because they say they didn't know any better," according to Jane Briggs Bunting, an attorney and director of the journalism department at Oakland University.

"County prosecutors are reductant to proceed against them (eity or township officials) because they've get other things to do," she said.

# Boat, camper shows are here

We've had hardly two inches of snow this winter, but already it's time to think spring. The boat and camper shows are coming up

The boat and camper shows are coming up this month.

The Greater Michigan Boat and Fishing Show runs from Friday to Feb. 13 in Cobo Hall in downtown Detroit.

"A lot of attendance is controlled by nature, and she dumped on us the last couple of years," asid Ray Underwood, executive director of Michigan Boating Industries Association, headquartered in Livonia. With good weather, this year's show should draw 80,000 to 100,000.

General admission is \$4.50, children and senior citizens pay \$2.50.

Underwood says boating pumps \$1 billion or more into the Michigan economy. That figures out to \$1,600 for each of Michigan's

600,000 registered boats, which sounds a bit high unless you credit some folks' total vacation expenditures to boating.

And If you though boating was losing popularity, 'think again. According to a Michigan State University study, state boaters logged 16.9 million boat days in 1980, an increase of 23 percent from 1977. Financing should be better this year. Historically, the area banks that are into marine lending will have some kind of low-rerate for 30-80 days during and following the boat show, 'Underwood said.

This is the 25th anniversary of the boat show, More than 750 watercraft ranging from nine to 44 feet will be on exhibit—along with accessories and exhibits.

THE CAMPER and Travel Trailer Show opens Feb. 11 in the armory at 15000 W. Eight Mile, Oak Park, and rurs 10 days.

More than 800 recreation vehicles and related exhibits will be on display, says David

S. Pickering, director of the Michigan Association of Recreational Vehicles and Campgrounds, also headquartered in Livonia.

Admissions are \$3 general, \$2 for kids aged 6-12, and \$1 for senior citizens.
It's a good spot to compare values in RVs, vans, motor homes, travel trailers, pop-up tent campers and truck campers. Other exhibits are on campgrounds and suppliers.
