And then there is the gay population — those who are "sick" or "wolrd" or whatever other tag has been attached to them. How do such people look when seen from the only line of vision open to those who live in that lonely world on the other side of the family in which they grew up?

How might we come to see such people if we lived in their world even for a short time? And how might we see ourselves when viewed from the perspective of one who hides in fear because exposure to something set in them before the age of 4 would mean the loss of their job and rejection by those they love, let alone the rest of their society?

About incontinence — can you suggest a way to live with it?

Dear H.E.:
Incontinence is the inability to have control over bladder or bowel functions. It is a common problem among

control over bladder or bowel functions. It is a common problem among older persons.

Before accepting and learning to live with the problem, it is essential that you explore every means of help available so that you can regain this bodily function. You should consult your doctor or a urologist (a doctor who specializes in problems in this area) to have a complete physical examination.

If your problem persists and you are in need of specific suggestions on how to deal with your individual incontinent needs, I suggest you contact a public health nurse in your community for her specialized assistance.

I found an excellent book for my mother age 84 who lives alone in her own home. It is called "An Easier Way: Handbook for the Elderly and Handicapped," written by Fean Viets Sargent, and published by the Iowa State University Press in Ames, Iowa. The book has countless belpful hints for persons such as my mother, as well as suggestions on the use of special equipment and other devices.
